Important Information About This Course

Genesis and Exodus

This Course Covers Two Bible Books -- Genesis and Exodus.

The study lasts for 18 months, including reviews at the end of each of the 8 Parts.

Purpose of This Course

- 1. To learn the major events and people of the first two books of the Bible in chronological order.
 - 2. To learn from the many lessons in the stories for our own lives.

Organization of This Course

The lessons are based on the **New King James Version**.

This study, taken directly from the Bible, covers the major events from the beginning of time at the Creation to the end of the book of Exodus.

The teacher must read and study the chapters indicated at the beginning of the Helps for each Part. This will help her to present the story correctly in its chronological order as well as apply the teaching to the students' lives in the best way.

SECTION 1 -- GENESIS

Section 1 --Genesis (Lessons 1--47) is divided into Parts 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 with a review lesson at the end of each Part.

The final lesson of Section 1 Genesis is a review of the entire book of Genesis.

SECTION 2 -- EXODUS

The lessons for Exodus (Lessons 48--78) are numbered consecutively after the final lesson of Genesis (#47) because the events in Exodus continue the history of the children of Israel.

Section 2 -- Exodus is divided into Parts 6, 7, and 8 with a review lesson at the end of each Part.

The final lesson of Section 2 Exodus is a review of the entire book of Exodus.

The outline for each book is at the beginning of its section.

<u>NOTE</u>: The English version is much enhanced, composed on the computer plus the hand drawings from the Spanish version. The Spanish version was written 17 years ago on a typewriter, using much less written material.

Lists

- 1. The list of the Days of Creation to take home (Lesson #1) to study.
- 2. The list of the Twelve Sons of Jacob will be taken home with lesson 34.

Verses

Each lesson has an identifying verse or verses. These should be memorized whenever possible. At the very least they should be read several times from the worksheet and identified with the large visualized picture during the lesson. These verses are used in the game for **Older** students to be matched with the picture they represent. Many of the verses are abbreviated to give the outstanding information only.

Visual Aids for Genesis

One of the purposes of this course is for the students to learn as well as possible the events in each book in chronological order.

To aid in this purpose all the pictures and verses are coordinated:

- --the pictures on each worksheet;
- -- the set of enlarged pictures for the accordion book;
- -- and the pictures for the game (a portion is to be made for each review).


In this way the students see the same picture many times to help the event stick in their minds.

The Accordion Folded Book

To make an accordion book for both ages that will stand up on the table: (See diagram below)

- 1. Cut pieces of medium weight cardboard the size of the large pictures.
- 2. Fasten the pieces of cardboard together end to end with strips of paper.
- 3. Paste the strips of paper lengthwise on the end of the cardboard, half on each of two

- pieces of the cardboard with half an inch space between the cardboards.
- 4. At the end of the second piece of cardboard paste another strip and a third cardboard to this strip.
- 5. Continue until you have the number of pieces of cardboard needed.
- 6. Paste the pictures that do **NOT say Younger Worksheet** in numerical -- chronological order onto the cardboard.
- 7. Fold the mounted pictures in opposite directions.
- 8. When it is time for a new Part, add more pieces of cardboard in the same manner. This makes it easier to fold the pictures into an accordion book.



Using the Accordion Folded Book

Use lots of repetition and take time each week to review, at least once, the theme of the previous lessons (illustrated in the pictures) along with the verses (for Older students).

At the end of the study of Genesis there is an extra review lesson to cover the entire book.

Game

Beginning with Lesson 4, make the game, adding new cards each lesson.

- Each <u>Older</u> student needs a copy of both the pictures and the verses for each Part as the lessons progress from Part 1 to Part 5. Each <u>Younger</u> student needs a copy of the pictures only.
- 2. Paste the pages for the Part to light cardboard.
- 3. Place them under heavy books or other objects until they are thoroughly dry.
- **4.** When dry, the students cut their pictures and verses on the lines and writes their name on the back of each piece .
- **5.** Each student needs an envelope in which to keep his game to which will be added more pieces with each Part.

Always spend sufficient time with the <u>Older</u> students repeatedly reading the verse that goes with the picture of each lesson. This coordination is very important in order for the game of the review lessons to function.

Family Tree Chart

In addition to worksheets, there is a Family Tree Chart for the <u>Older</u> students to be filled in as the people appear in the stories. A completed copy as the Teacher's Key is included.

Younger Students' Picture Worksheets

Worksheets for the Younger Students are special copies of the same full-page pictures used to make the accordion book. These helps offer a specific idea of how to decorate the picture-worksheet of each lesson. As the students work, talk about the picture, using ideas from the Older worksheets.

Special Activities for Genesis

Instructions and patterns for each special activity are on separate pages.

Part 1 -- clothespin animals.

Part 2 -- a large tent of cloth.

Part 3 -- a well of clay and a clay water pot.

Part 4 -- double stand-up sheep and goats.

Part 5 -- standup figures of the 12 sons of Jacob.

Maps

Make a large-sized copy of the enclosed maps to be used throughout the course. Make a small red flag and attach it to a pin to use as a marker on the map. OR Paste a small picture at the place where it happened.

Each older student should have smaller copies to follow along.

Before You Begin Teaching This Course

IMPORTANT NOTE: Read all the chapters included for each PART before you begin to prepare the first lesson of that Part. This will give you a more comprehensive idea of what is happening. Remember it is a continuing story, not just separate events. There sometimes is overlapping in the lessons. Having read all the chapters will help you to make the proper divisions.

PART 1 -- THE CREATION, ADAM AND NOAH

Read Genesis, Chapters 1 through 11.

Lesson 1

Story: The Creation -- Genesis 1:1 to 2:3.

Application: The world was planned and made by God.

<u>Study Helps:</u> "Genesis" means "beginning." Genesis tells the beginning of the world and of man. Also the beginning of sin, of rain, of sacrifice, and others.

In the New King James Version when you see LORD it means that the Hebrew has the name of the LORD which is Jehovah. LORD has been used in any quote where it occurs in the text. It would be good to explain this to the students.

<u>NOTE</u>: Lesson 2 is about the creation of man and woman. They will of course, be included as part of Lesson 1 but not in detail. The details are for Lesson 2. Take time to review Lesson 2 now so that you are acquainted with the emphasis of the study in both lessons.

Visual Aids: Begin the accordion book.

<u>Worksheet:</u> <u>Younger:</u> Pictures of the sun, moon, stars and fish to complete the large picture of creation are on Extra Things for Worksheets Younger, page 1. Teacher cuts them out ahead of

class and students paste them. Then, color the night sky dark. Color the day sky blue. Talk about who made the things in the picture.

Older: After the lesson, drill the students in what was created each day so that they will have little difficulty arranging the small pictures in proper order. Pictures to paste are on Extra Things for Worksheets Older, page 1.

Part 1 Cover -- Students color the words, Genesis tells us about: Greation, Adam amd Noah and the picture that goes with this lesson. Print Creation under the correct picture.

At the end of class give each student a page with the list of the **Days of Creation**. Tell them this is an assignment to be memorized at home. You will check to see who can say them next week or during the next several weeks. Also place a duplicate sheet in each student's folder. When the student can say them all correctly, place a star on his folder sheet.

Verse: Memorize the verse that goes with the picture of the lesson-- Genesis 1:1.

Special Activities: Begin the activity for Part 1 which is to make stand-up animals, using pincher clothespins. There are 7 animals. Each animal will need 2 clothespins. Animals may be colored first. Then paste on light cardstock. Dry well. Cut out and attach clothespins. See patterns and instructions on separate pages.

Lesson 2

Story: The Creation of Adam and Eve -- Genesis 1:26-30 and 2:4-25.

Application: God made man in His own image. That means that each of us is made in the image of God.

Study Helps: A copy of the chart from the course The World We Cannot See is enclosed. Discuss with the class the differences between man and animals.

Explain being made in the image of God: God is a Spirit and man also has a spirit. Animals do not have spirits. Things that show that we are made in God's image (worksheet) are that man can talk, think, be sad or happy and laugh.

In addition to the Scriptures on the Older worksheet--God's Command to Man and What Did God Give to Man -- Psalm 8:4-8 says "You have made him man to have dominion over the works of Your hands; You have put all things under his feet, All sheep and oxen--Even the beasts of the field, The birds of the air, And the fish of the sea That pass through the paths of the seas."

Explain: "helper comparable" (2:18) -- Some older versions of the Bible say "helpmeet." Others say "suitable." Someone has pointed out that God did not make the woman from a bone in man's foot so he could walk on her. Nor did God make her from a bone in man's head so she could rule over the man. God made woman from a rib from man's side so she could walk beside him, work with him, and help him.

The first use of the word: "command" is in Genesis 2:16. A command is an order given by an authority (God) that is to be obeyed.

Visual Aids: Picture for the accordion book.

Magazine or newspaper pictures of people and animals.

Map -- the Garden of Eden. The exact location is not known but because two rivers are named that we know today it is possible that it was in the area marked on Map 1.

Worksheet: All Students: Cover for Part 1 -- picture and words--Adam and Eve.

Younger: Paste bits of raveled yarn for "hair" on Adam and Eve. Talk about God's plan that marriage is to be between one man and one woman. Other ideas on Older worksheet.

Older: Answers to "Important Facts to Remember": spirit, talk, think, sad, happy, laugh.

Verse: Check to see if anyone is ready to say the days of creation.

Genesis 1:27 abbreviated: God created man in His own image... male and female He created them.

Special Activities: Clothespin animals.

Lesson 3

Story: The First Sin -- Genesis 3.

Application: Where and when sin began on the earth.

<u>Study Helps:</u> <u>Temptation</u> is the urge, the strong desire to sin. James 1:12-15 God does not tempt us but He allows Satan to tempt us. 1 John 2:15-17 divides temptations into 3 groups--"lust of the flesh" the strong desire to use our bodies in the wrong way; "lust of the eyes"--the strong desire to do something wrong because of what we see; "pride of life"--the strong desire to do what will make us better than others, to be famous, to show off how great we are. We can choose to follow the urge or refuse it. Eve followed all three urges.

1 Timothy 2:11-14 Eve was deceived; Adam sinned knowing what he did.

Revelation 12:9 gives names and identities of Satan, including one who deceives.

Sin is disobeying what God has said for us to do or not to do. (1 John 3:4)

Be sure not to call the forbidden fruit an apple. The Bible does not say what kind of fruit it was.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Worksheet: Younger: Use the serpent pattern on Patterns for Worksheets Younger, page 1. to cut out a green serpent to paste on the picture. Color picture. Other ideas on Older worksheet.

Older: Boxes telling the punishments for students to paste in the correct places are on Extra Things for Worksheets, page 1. Be ready to explain 1 John 2:15-17 (see Study Helps).

Cover. No picture today.

Verse: Genesis 3:6 abbreviated: The woman saw that the tree was good for food... she took of its fruit and ate... She also gave to her husband... and he ate.

Ask: each week, "Who can say the days of creation?"

Special Activities: Clothespin animals.

Lesson 4

Story: Cain and Abel -- Genesis 4 and 5.

Application: Jealousy and anger can cause you to do worse sins.

Study Helps: Hebrews 11:4 gives us inspired insight into Cain and Abel.

Explain:

<u>sacrifice</u>--giving something special of your own to God as a gift. Sometimes the sacrifices were burnt on an altar.

wanderer--a person who moves around and doesn't have one special place as his home.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Worksheet: Younger: Prepare cotton and dried grass to represent the sacrifices so that the students can paste them on the sacrifices in the picture. Talk about the application of the lesson.

Verse: Genesis 4:3,4 -- Cain brought an offering of the fruit of the ground to the LORD. Abel also brought of the firstborn of his flock and of their fat.

Special Activities: Begin making the game, adding new cards each lesson. See the instructions on Page 2 of these Helps.

Lesson 5

Story: The Flood Destroys the Earth -- Genesis 6 and 7; 2 Peter 2:5.

Application: God hates sin and He will not always wait for man to stop sinning.

Study Helps: Explain: flood--when water covers land.

Others scriptures of interest: 1 Peter 3:20,21; Matthew 24:37-39; 2 Peter 2:5; Psalm 104:3-9; Hebrews 11:7.

Visual Aids: Accordion book. Pictures of animals (Library books, encyclopedias, magazines).

Worksheet: Cover: picture and words -- Noah.

Younger: A puzzle of the animals entering the ark. <u>Teacher</u>: Well before class, the pattern for cutting should be pasted on the back of the picture with a piece of lightweight cardboard between the picture and cutting pattern. Allow it to dry under heavy weight. <u>Students</u> in class color the picture. <u>Teacher</u> cuts it along the lines on the back, extending each cutting line across the borders. In the next lesson session the students can put the puzzle together. Place the pieces for each puzzle in a separate envelope with the student's name. <u>Older:</u> Genesis 6:15,16 give us the dimensions in cubits.

Change the cubits to inches and then to feet.

length 300 cubits = 5400 inches = 450 feet.

height 30 cubits = 540 inches = 45 feet.

depth 50 cubits = 900 inches = 75 feet.

Each deck was 10 feet high.

Verse: Genesis 7:5,6 -- Noah did according to all that the LORD commanded him...and the floodwaters were on the earth.

Special Activities: Continue making the clothespin animals.

Lesson 6

Story: A New Beginning -- Genesis 8:1 to 9:17.

Application: God keeps His promises.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Map--Locate the mountains on which the ark came to rest: Ararat (8:4).

Worksheet: Younger: and Older: Color the rainbow by following the numbers and key from top to bottom--1=red, 2=orange, 3=yellow, 4=green, 5=indigo blue, 6=violet.

Older:

How Long Was Noah in the Ark?

Came out of the ark (8:13,14)

year 601 month 2 day 27

Entered the ark (7:11)

year 600 month 2 day 17

Total time

1 year 0 months 10 days

Teacher: Be careful with 8:13,14.

Verse 13 tells the year

BUT verse 14 tells the month and day when Noah was told to leave the ark.

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 9:13,15 -- "I set My rainbow in the cloud...the sign...between Me and the earth...the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh."

Special Activities: Clothespin animals.

Lesson 7

Story: The Tower of Babel -- Genesis 11:1-9.

Application: Languages come from God.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

<u>Map</u> -- Locate (11:2) Shinar, (Babel--Babylonia). Chart of many languages included in this packet.

<u>Worksheet:</u> <u>Cover:</u> picture and words -- <u>Tower of Babel</u>. <u>Younger:</u> With a pencil follow the stairs from the bottom to the top of the tower. Adapt ideas on Older worksheet for discussion.

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 11:9 -- Its name is called Babel, because there the LORD confused the language of all the earth.

Special Activities: Finish the clothespin animals.

Lesson 8 Review of Part 1.

<u>Worksheet:</u> There are no worksheets for review lessons. No large picture for Accordion Book. **Game:**

This is the first part of a game. Each review lesson will add more. It is made up of duplicate pictures and verses from the worksheets and accordion book.

<u>Older Students: The object of the game</u> is to put the pictures in chronological order and match it with the verse that identifies it. Repeated playing the game will help the students to remember the important people and events of Genesis.

Younger Students: Those who cannot read can put the pictures in the correct order and repeat aloud the verses or name the people and event.

Variations of the game:

Individuals trying to do it without error.

Two students competing against each other.

The class divided into teams to compete.

Each time the game is played, the students shuffle their two piles of cards before matching them.

From now on, when you have extra time in a class period, use the game.

IMPORTANT: These game pieces <u>must stay</u> in an envelope in each student's folder because they will be used throughout Section 1 as we study Genesis.

PART 2 -- ABRAHAM Read Genesis, Chapters 11 through 20.

Lesson 9

Story: Abram's Trip -- Genesis 11:27 to 12:20.

Application: We must believe what God says and obey Him like Abram did.

Study Helps: Hebrews 11:8-10 (used on the worksheet).

Imagine with the students what it would be like to have to pack up and leave your home to go live somewhere you had never seen in a far away land.

Do not spend much time with Abram's time in Egypt and his lie about his wife except to show that he was not a perfect man. However, God had a plan for him and he had great faith in God. Abram lies about his wife again later (Lesson 17) at which time the main topic will be that telling half the truth is telling a lie.

<u>Visual Aids:</u> Map -- Move the flag on a pin to each place as you tell the story. Ur (11:28); Haran (11:31; 12:4); Canaan (12:5), Shechem (12:,6); Bethel (12:8 east of Ai); Egypt (12:10). Accordion book.

Worksheet: All Students: Cover for Part 2 -- Color the words @@m@sis @ells ws albow@ Albraham. Color the picture of the caravan of people and write Abram under the picture.

Younger: Color the picture of the caravan. Talk about who was moving to where.

Older: Answers to Map of Abram's Trip -- 11:31 Ur ; 11:31 Haran ; 12:4 Haran ;

12:5 Canaan ; 12:6 Shechem ; 12:8 Bethel ; 12:10 Egypt .

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 12:1 -- "The LORD had said to Abram: "Get out of your country from your family and from your father's house...to a land that I will show you."

<u>Special Activities:</u> Part 2--Make a tent big enough for a child to sit in. When the tent is complete, each student can take a turn sitting in it. Keep the tent in place throughout Part 2 so everyone remembers the way Abraham lived.

Older: Begin filling in The Family Tree page. Today: Terah (11:27) is already on the chart because he is the beginning of the story of Abraham. Today add-- Abram, Sarai (11:29). Notice that Abram's brother Nahor and his wife Milcah (11:29) as well as Haran and son Lot (11:27) are also already on the chart. They will be mentioned in later stories also. A completed copy of The Family Tree is enclosed for the teacher's use.

<u>Game:</u> Each week, as time permits, have the students prepare the picture and verse that go with the lesson. That way they can be building the game weekly.

Lesson 10

Story: Abram and Lot Separate -- Genesis 13.

Application: There is always a peaceful way to resolve a quarrel.

<u>Study Helps:</u> Explain: <u>herd</u> -- a group of cattle. <u>flock</u> -- a group of sheep. <u>descendant</u> -- people born to a person starting with their children, and continuing with grandchildren, great-grandchildren, etc. The Bible itself explains in Genesis 46:6, 7.

Visual Aids: Accordion book

Map --Bethel (Ai 13:3); plain of Jordan (13:10) Sodom, Gomorrah, Zoar (13:10); Mamre in Hebron (13:18)

Worksheet: Younger: Color figures on Extra Things for Worksheets Younger, page 1. Cut them out on the broken lines. To make the spring: 1. Cut it out on the broken line. 2. Fold it back and forth on the solid lines. 3. Paste one end to the back of the figures. 4. Paste the other end to the same figures on the picture. This gives a shadow effect. Use *Things to Talk About* on Older page.

<u>Older:</u> Things that children quarrel about: toys, being first, food, who will sit by the window in the bus or car, space to play in the house, angry words, name calling, etc. How to solve quarrels: Let others choose first; take turns; ask an adult to help; separate; etc.

Cover -- picture of Abram and Lot; word -- Lot

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 13:8 -- Abram said to Lot, "Please let there be no strife between you and me...for we are brethren."

Special Activities: Older: The Family Tree Point out Lot and his relationship to Abram.

Lesson 11

Story: Abram Rescues Lot -- Genesis 14.

<u>Application:</u> We should help our family when they are in trouble. (But be sure to explain that Christians do not fight with weapons or fists to help others.)

Study Helps: Christian's way of fighting: Eph. 6:11-18; 2 Cor. 10:3-5.

Explain: <u>tithe</u> -- one-tenth of what you have. If you have 10 dollars then one of the dollars would be one-tenth.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Map -- Shinar, Elam, Sodom, Gomorrah, Zoar (14:1,2); Salt Sea (14:3); Damascus (14:15); Salem (14:18).

<u>Worksheet:</u> <u>Younger:</u> In addition to the worksheet, have 10 pennies. Lay them out and talk about how much one-tenth would be. This will give the children an idea of how Abraham divided the things to give to Melchizedek.

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 14:16 -- "*Abram* brought back all the goods, and also...his brother Lot and his goods...and the people."

Special Activities: tent.

Lesson 12

Story: God Repeats His Promise to Abram -- Genesis 15.

Application: God makes promises but we have to wait until He is ready to keep them.

<u>Study Helps:</u> Ask the students if they have ever tried to count the stars. What a fantastic promise God made to Abram, a man who was getting old and who had no children yet. Explain: <u>covenant</u> -- a treaty, agreement between two people.

righteousness -- right according to God.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Map -- Locate the area of land that God was promising to Abram's descendants (15:18). "To your descendants I have given this land, from the river of Egypt to the great river, the River Euphrates." NOTE: "the river of Egypt is a small river as indicated on the map. It is NOT the Nile River which is in Egypt.

Pictures of the heavens at night showing the stars.

Worksheet: Younger: Buy sticker stars for the students to put on their large pictures.

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 15:4,5 -- *God* brought him outside and said, "Look now toward heaven, and count the stars if you are able to number them...So shall your descendants be."

Lesson 13

Story: The Birth of Ishmael -- Genesis 16:1 to 17:9 and 17:15-22.

Application: Being impatient can get us into trouble.

Study Helps: Ishmael became the father of the Arabs.

Prepare a discussion about times the students got impatient and got into trouble. Some examples:

Got tired of waiting for supper and took some bread without asking.

Got tired of helping little brother and pushed him away.

Got tired of trying to do my math problems and tore up the paper.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

<u>Worksheet:</u> <u>Cover</u> -- Ishmael. <u>Younger:</u> Paste a flannel blanket on the baby. Talk about *God's law of Marriage* on Older worksheet.

Verse: Genesis 16:15 -- "Hagar bore Abram a son; and Abram named his son Ishmael."

<u>Special Activities:</u> <u>Older:</u> <u>Family Tree</u>: (Hagar) Ishmael (16:3,15). Under Abram write Abraham (17:5); Under Sarai write Sarah (17:15).

Lesson 14

Story: Three Visitors -- Genesis 18:1-16.

<u>Application:</u> We must always be polite to visitors who come to our house.

<u>Study Helps:</u> When angels appeared to people they looked like men. These three men would seem to be angels because they came with messages from God. Sometimes even the name, "the LORD," is used for one of them when he speaks to Abram. Later in chapter 19:1, two of them are called angels when they arrive at Sodom.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Map -- Mamre.

<u>Worksheet:</u> <u>Younger:</u> Figure of Abram and 3 visitors on Extra Things for Worksheets Younger page 1. Color, cut out, and paste them on the background to complete the picture.

Older: Pictures to paste in correct order are on Extra Things for Worksheets, Older, page 1. Order: Abraham sees men coming; Abraham talks to Sarah; the food; Abraham sits with visitors; Sarah laughing; Abraham sees men leave.

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 18:13,14 -- The LORD said to Abraham... "At the appointed time I will return to you...and Sarah shall have a son."

Special Activities: tent.

<u>Game:</u> Each week, as time permits, have the students prepare the picture and verse that go with the lesson. That way they can be building the game weekly.

Lesson 15

Story: Abraham's Prayer -- Genesis 18:16-33.

Application: We should not be afraid to talk to God about anything.

<u>Study Helps:</u> God does not have a conversation with us but He aids our minds to understand what He wants us to do based on what He has told us in the Bible.

<u>Visual Aids:</u> Accordion book. Map -- Sodom, Gomorrah. <u>Worksheet:</u> <u>Younger:</u> Figure of Abraham praying on Extra Things for Worksheets Younger page 1. Color, cut out, and paste him on the background to complete the picture. Talk about *Why de we want to talk to God?* on Older worksheet.

Verse: Genesis 18:20, 23 -- The LORD said, "The outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah is great, and their sin is very grave" Abraham came near and said, "Would You also destroy the righteous with the wicked?"

Lesson 16

Story: The Destruction of Sodom and Gomorra -- Genesis 19:1-29.

Application: God hates sin but He has mercy on those who believe in Him.

Study Helps: Other scriptures that give a fuller picture of Sodom and Gomorrah:

Ezekiel 16:49, 50; Jude 7; 2 Peter 2:6-9.

Do not dwell on the sexual perversion of the Sodomites, but say that they wished to sin with the visitors like the homosexuals of today.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Map -- Sodom (19:1,28), Gomorrah (19:28), Zoar (19:29).

<u>Worksheet:</u> <u>Younger:</u> Use the patterns of fire on Patterns for Worksheets Younger, page 1, to cut fire from red paper. Students paste the fire coming down from heaven over the cities.

Older: Patterns for students to cut fire from red paper are on Extra Things for Worksheets Older, page 2. Paste coming down from heaven on cities.

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 19:24, 25 -- "The LORD rained brimstone and fire on Sodom and Gomorrah... So He overthrew those cities."

Lesson 17

Story: Abraham Tells Half of the Truth -- Genesis 20.

Application: To tell only half of the truth to hide something is to actually to tell a lie.

<u>Study Helps:</u> This is the second time that Abraham has done this (see Lesson 9--Gen. 12:10-20). Genesis 20:12 explains how it was a half truth. Even though he believed God, he sometimes did things wrong. **Spend time with examples of half truths that are lies.**

Teacher cut a slit in the cloth robes and around Abraham's hand before the students paste the cloth robe so that his hand will be outside the robe. Use idea on Older worksheet. Older: Figures to paste are on Extra Things for Worksheets, Older, page 2.

Verse: Genesis 20:2 -- Abraham said of Sarah his wife, "She is my sister."

Lesson 18 Review Part 2

Have the students tell the stories of Abraham. As each one tells a story, the student can sit in the **tent** facing the class. There is no large picture for the Accordion Book.

Continue the game. See the instructions with the first review, Lesson 8.

PART 3 -- ISAAC Read Genesis, Chapters 21 through 26.

Lesson 19

Story: The Birth of Isaac -- Genesis 21:1-20.

Application: We can believe God because He keeps His promises.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Map -- Beersheba (21:14).

Worksheet: Younger: Put gray "hair" on Sarah and Abraham. Use raveled yarn.

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 21:2 -- Sarah conceived and bore Abraham a son in his old age, at the set time of which God had spoken to him.

Special Activities: Older: Family Tree: Isaac (21:3).

Lesson 20

Story: Abraham Makes a Covenant -- Genesis 21:22-34.

Application: We can live in peace with others, if each one makes an agreement with the other.

Study Helps: Background material for this lesson is found in Genesis 20.

Explain: <u>covenant</u> -- an agreement, a treaty, a formal promise with an oath made by 2 people or by 2 or more nations.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Map -- Beersheba.

Worksheet: Younger: Two figures to cut out and paste on springs over figures on the picture. Extra Things for Worksheets Younger, page 2. Color figures. Cut them out on the broken lines. To make the springs: 1. Cut them out on the broken line. 2. Fold each back and forth on the solid lines. 3. Paste one end to the back of the figure. 4. Paste the other end to the same figure on the picture. This gives a shadow effect. Use *How Many?* on Older worksheet.

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 21:27 -- Abraham took sheep and oxen and gave them to Abimelech, and the two of them made a covenant.

Special Activities: Each student begins making a well out of "clay." See instructions included.

Lesson 21

Story: Abraham Sacrifices Isaac -- Genesis 22:1-19.

<u>Application:</u> Abraham had faith that God keeps His promises. We must also believe what God says and obey Him.

Study Helps: Hebrews 11:17-19.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

The Map--locate land of Moriah (22:2), Beersheba.

Worksheet: All Students: Cover for Part 3 -- color words and identify Isaac.

Younger: Paste cotton on the ram. Talk about Hebrews 11:17-19.

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 22:12 -- The LORD said, "Now I know that you fear God, since you have not withheld your son, your only son, from Me."

Lesson 22

Story: Abraham Buys a Cave -- Genesis 23.

<u>Application:</u> Abraham asked to buy what he needed. We should ask before we use something that belongs to someone else.

Study Helps: Explain the hard words in the Verse:

foreigner--someone from another country.

property--things, like land and houses, owned by a person.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Map -- Hebron (23:2).

<u>Worksheet:</u> Cover: identify <u>Abraham.</u> Younger: Color the picture. Talk about *What should you do if:* on Older worksheet.

Older: Discuss the section, What should you do if: with the students.

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 23:4 -- Abraham said "I am a foreigner and a visitor among you. Give me property...that I may bury my dead."

Lesson 23

Story: A Wife for Isaac -- Genesis 24.

Application: It is very important to choose carefully whom you will marry.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

The Map--the journey of the servant from Hebron (23:19) to Haran (the city of Nahor) (24:10) in MESOPOTAMIA.

<u>Worksheet:</u> Cover: Identify Rebekah. <u>Younger:</u> Patterns for making clothes out of cloth for the servant and Rebekah are on Patterns for Worksheets Younger page 2.

Older: Prepare small pictures on Extra Things for Worksheets Older, page 2 for students to paste in the correct order. Abraham talks to servant; camels leaving; Servant prays at well; Rebekah pours water; servant talks to Laban; Laban, Bethuel, Rebekah; camels return; Isaac welcomes Rebekah.

Verse: Genesis 24:67 -- Isaac took Rebekah and she became his wife, and he loved her.

Special Activities: Finish the well and make a small water pot out of clay.

Older: Add to the Family Tree: Rebekah (24:15). Point out Rebekah's family which is already on the chart; Nahor and Milcah (24:15), her father Bethuel (24:15), and her brother Laban (24:29). Begin asking questions about family relationships such as, "Who was Isaac's father? his mother? Who was Abraham's wife?" etc.

Lesson 24

Story: Esau Sells His Birthright to Jacob -- Genesis 25:8-11,19-34.

<u>Application:</u> Sometimes things seem very important at the moment, but if we do it now, how will it affect the future? Think before you decide to do something.

Study Helps: Background: Genesis 25:7-11

Explain: <u>firstborn</u>— the first place, the place of most importance among the children, having to do with authority and what the person receives of his father's things when the father dies. The firstborn became the head of the family and received a double amount of his father's things. The firstborn rights were given to the son whom the father chose and was not necessarily the son born first.

swear--to say something is true, calling on the name of God as your witness.

Visuals: Map -- Mamre (25:9).

<u>Worksheet:</u> <u>Younger:</u> paste small sticks and clear red paper fire under pot. Use ideas from Choosing What is Most Important on the Older worksheet.

Older: Discuss the part, Choosing What is Most Important with the students. Use other examples also. Cover: Identify Jacob and Esau.

Verse: Genesis 25:33 -- Esau swore to him, and sold his birthright to Jacob."

<u>Special Activities:</u> <u>Older:</u> <u>Family Tree</u>: *Jacob* (25:26), *Esau* (25:25). Ask "Who?" questions about family relationships. Ex: "Who was Jacob and Esau's grandfather?"

Lesson 25

Story: Isaac's Wells -- Genesis 26:1-33.

Application: It is better to let someone take your things than to fight about it.

Study Helps: Related scriptures for your study: Mateo 5:9; 1 Corinthians 6:1-11.

Explain: oath -- a sworn agreement.

<u>covenant</u> -- an agreement, a treaty, a formal promise with an oath made by 2 or more people or by 2 or more nations.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Map -- Gerar (26:6), Beersheba (26:23,33).

<u>Worksheet:</u> Younger: Paste the well (on Extra Things for Worksheets Younger page 1) between Isaac and Abimeleck. Use *Choosing to do what we should* on Older worksheet.

Older: Discuss the part, Choosing to do what we should with the students. Use other examples.

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 26:28 -- *The Philistines said to Isaac*, "Let there now be an oath between us, between you and us... and let us make a covenant with you."

Special Activities: the well and water pot.

Lesson 26 Review of Part 3

PART 4 -- JACOB Read Genesis, Chapters 26 through 35.

Lesson 27

Story: Jacob Receives the Blessing -- Genesis 26:34 to 28:5.

Application: To lie and steal are sins even when someone in the family says to do them.

Study Helps: Background: Lesson #24, the contrast between Jacob and Esau.

Explain: <u>blessing</u>--something good that a person receives. hate--to not be able to stand the sight of another.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

<u>Worksheet:</u> <u>Younger:</u> Paste lamb's wool on Jacob's neck and arms. Talk about how bad it is to tell a lie. <u>Older:</u> The worksheets of Part 5 include code words. The <u>code card</u> for each student is on Extra Things for Worksheets Older page 2. Have them ready to distribute. Explain how to decipher a code. Be sure the students save their code cards in their folders. Discuss how Jacob's family should have acted. Answers to *One Lie Leads to Another* 1+1+3+1+1=8.

All Students: Cover for Part 4 -- Color words and identify Jacob.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Map -- Beersheba (26:33), Haran in PADAN-ARAM (27:43; 28:2).

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 27:41 -- Esau hated Jacob because of the blessing with which his father blessed him.

<u>Special Activities:</u> Each student begins making stand-up figures of sheep and goats. See patterns and instructions on separate pages.

Older: Family Tree: Genesis 28:5 gives some of the names already on the tree. Point them out so the students can understand who is related to whom.

Lesson 28

Story: Jacob's Vision -- Genesis 28:6-22.

<u>Application:</u> God had special ways of speaking to people long ago. Now He speaks to us when we read the Bible.

<u>Study Helps:</u> Be sure to explain the meaning of the word in Gen. 28:17 "<u>awesome</u>"-- fear mixed with reverence and wonder. Only God and the things associated with God are awesome. The way people use this word nowadays is totally wrong because every little thing is said to be awesome. Study the use of the word in the Bible.

God uses imperfect and even wicked people to carry out His purposes. It does not mean that God approves of the sins of the person He is using. Abraham lied as did Isaac also. Now we have Jacob who plotted with his mother to deceive his father. But God was using him because God had a long-range plan. Jesus was the only perfect, sinless person in God's plan.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Worksheet: Younger: Teacher: Well before class, the pattern for cutting should be pasted on the back of the picture. Allow it to dry under heavy weight. Students in class color the picture. Teacher cuts it along the lines on the back, extending all lines across the borders. In the next lesson session the students can put the puzzle together. Place the pieces for each puzzle in a separate envelope with the student's name.

Older: Code cards.

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 28:14 -- *The* LORD *said to Jacob,* "In you and in your seed all the families of the earth shall be blessed."

Lesson 29

Story: Jacob Comes to the Well -- Genesis 29:1-13.

Application: We should be ready and willing to help someone weaker than we are.

Study Helps: Explain: flock--a group of sheep.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Make a well of clay pieces resembling stones. Make a flat piece for the top. Map -- Haran.

Worksheet: Younger: Paste bits of cotton on sheep. Cut palm leaves out of green paper to paste on the palm trees. Fold in the middle, a piece of green construction paper or crepe paper 3" wide and 1½" long. Place the pattern (on Patterns for Worksheets Younger, page 2) on the fold and cut out the leaf through both thicknesses. Open and paste only one side to the worksheet. Each student needs 4. Also talk about What can you do to help...on the Older worksheet.

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 29:10 -- When Jacob saw Rachel...and the sheep...Jacob went near and rolled the stone from the well's mouth, and watered the flock.

Special Activities: double stand-up sheep and goats.

Lesson 30

Story: Jacob Gets Married -- Genesis 29:14 to 30:13,17-24.

Application: Having more than one wife causes problems because it not according to God's way.

<u>Study Helps:</u> Explain that God allowed men to have more than one wife according to the custom of the times. However, it never was according to His plan. God wanted man to have only one wife. Genesis 2:18-25; Matthew 19:4-6. Jesus says that people who do not follow God's plan have hard hearts, want to do things their own way.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Worksheet: Cover: Identify Rachel and Leah. Older: Code cards. Younger: Instead of an activity on the picture for Lesson 30, talk about God's important command for marriage--one man and one woman. Enclosed is a special page of the figures of a modern day bride and groom, titled God's Command for Marriage, One Man and One Woman. Each student needs a copy mounted on lightweight cardboard. 1. The teacher ahead of time cuts out the bride and groom just inside the broken lines. 2. Cut out the stands. 3. To make the stands: fold the stand on the small solid line. 4. Students paste the tab to the back of the figure at the waist line. Stand them.

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 29:30 -- *Jacob...*loved Rachel more than Leah. And he served with Laban still another seven years.

Special Activities: double stand-up sheep and goats.

Older: Family Tree: Leah (29:23), (Zilpah)(30:9), Rachel (29:28), (Bilhah)(30:4). Ask "Who?" questions about family relationships.

Lesson 31

Story: Jacob Flees From Laban -- Genesis 30:25 to 31:21.

Application: When families have problems with relatives, it is better to separate.

Study Helps: Explain: countenance -- face.

livestock -- farm animals: sheep, goats, cattle, etc.

<u>Jacob's rods</u> -- This is a strange story but one thing we know that whatever was going on, God was working in favor of Jacob.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Map -- mountains of Gilead (31:21).

Worksheet: Older: Code cards. Younger: Talk about what you should do when someone lies to you.

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 31:13 -- *God said to Jacob*, "Arise, get out of this land, and return to the land of your family."

Special Activities: sheep and goats.

Lesson 32

Story: Laban Pursues Jacob -- Genesis 31:22-55.

Application: It is better to come to an agreement than to fight with one another even when the other person has done something wrong against you.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Map -- mountains of Gilead.

<u>Worksheet:</u> <u>Younger:</u> Paste Laban and Jacob (Extra Things for Worksheets Younger, Page 2.) Talk about what happens when people agree. See Older worksheet ideas. <u>Older:</u> Code cards. <u>Cover -- Laban</u> and <u>Jacob</u>.

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 31:49 -- *Laban said to Jacob,* "May the LORD watch between you and me when we are absent one from another."

Lesson 33

Story: Jacob Meets Esau -- Genesis 32:1 to 33:20.

<u>Application:</u> When two people have been enemies it is a wonderful thing to become friends again.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Map -- EDOM, Seir, Shechem.

<u>Worksheet:</u> <u>Younger:</u> Paste Jacob and Esau (Extra Things for Worksheets Younger, page 2.) <u>Cover -- Jacob</u> and <u>Esau</u>.

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 33:4 -- Esau ran to meet *Jacob*, embraced him, and fell on his neck and kissed him, and they wept.

Special Activities: sheep and goats.

Lesson 34

Story: God Blesses Jacob in Bethel -- Genesis 35:1-20, 27-29.

Application: We cannot have idols and worship the one true God at the same time.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Map -- Bethel, Bethlehem, Mamre, (Hebron)

Worksheet: Younger: Cut the altar out of lightweight cardboard using the pattern on Patterns for Worksheets Younger page 2. Students fill in the lines to represent the stones.

Older: Code cards.

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 35:9, 10 -- God appeared to Jacob again...and said to him, "Your name is Jacob... but Israel shall be your name."

Give each student a copy of the <u>Twelve Sons of Jacob</u> to be memorized at home. Place another copy in each student's folder. When a student can name them all from memory, place a star on his folder sheet.

<u>Special Activities:</u> <u>Older:</u> <u>Family Tree</u>: Under Jacob add (*Israel*) (35:10); *Ruben, Simeon, Levi, Issachar, Zebulun, Dan Naphtali, Gad, Asher, Benjamin* (all named in 35:22-26). Ask "Who?" guestions about family relationships. Add "brother."

<u>Lesson 35</u> Review of Part 4.

Memory: Be sure to check on who can name the Twelve Sons of Jacob from memory.

Game: Play Part 4 first. Then add the other three parts, one at a time, in this order, 3, 2, 1. Another type of review: See who can put just the title cards studied so far in correct order.

PART 5 -- JOSE Read Genesis, Chapters 37 through 50.

Lesson 36

Story: Joseph's Dreams -- Genesis 37:1-11.

Application: We must do what is right even if someone else is the favorite person at home or at school.

<u>Study Helps:</u> Explain: <u>sheaf</u>--grain that is cut and put together in a bundle. hate--to dislike to extremes; to detest.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

The Map -- land of Canaan.

Pictures of sheaves.

<u>Worksheet:</u> Younger: Cut Joseph's coat from striped or plaid cloth (Pattern page 2 of Patterns for Worksheets Younger.). Students paste it on Joseph.

All Students: Cover for Part 5 -: Joseph

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 37:5-- Joseph had a dream, and he told it to his brothers; and they hated him even more.

Special Activities: Make stand-up spoon figures of the 12 sons of Jacob. Instructions are on a separate page. Make Joseph with a coat of many colors to go with the story today.

Game: Work on the new parts of the game to have it complete for Lessons 46 and 47.

Lesson 37

Story: Joseph is Sold by His Brothers-- Genesis 37:12-36.

Application: Jealousy and hatred lead to more sin.

<u>Study Helps:</u> The probable explanation as to why the travelers are called both Ishmaelites and Midianites is that they were Ishmaelites who came from the land of Midian.

Explain: conspire -- plan and act together to do an evil thing. devour -- to eat up.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

The Map -- Shechem, valley of Hebron, Dotham, Gilead, Egypt.

<u>Worksheet:</u> Younger: Paste black paper over the pit hole. Pattern on Patterns for Younger Worksheets, page 3.

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 37:28 -- The brothers pulled Joseph up...out of the pit, and sold him to the Ishmaelites for 20 shekels of silver. They took Joseph to Egypt.

<u>Special Activities:</u> Continue the spoon people. Remove Joseph's coat of many colors and put a plain one on him.

Lesson 38

Story: Joseph and Potiphar's Wife -- Genesis 39:1-20.

Application: Sometimes we get punished wrongfully when we have actually done the right thing.

Study Helps: Explain: flee-is to run away from something as quickly as possible.

fornication--is to take someone you are not married to and act sexually with that person as if you were married to him or her.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

The Map -- Egypt.

Worksheet: Younger: 'Paste cloth over Joseph's robe in woman's hands. Pattern on Patterns for Younger Worksheets, page 2. Talk about *How should we act?* on Older worksheet.

Older: Discuss with the students--Sometimes we have to suffer because we refuse to sin against God. How should we act? (examples on worksheet)

<u>Verse:</u> Genesis 39:9 -- *Joseph said to Potiphar's wife,* "How then can I do this great wickedness, and sin against God?"

Special Activities: 12 sons spoon people.

Lesson 39

Story: Joseph in Prison -- Genesis 39:20 to 40:23.

<u>Application:</u> We must continue to have faith in God and follow Him when we are suffering hardship.

Study Helps: Explain: affliction--suffering very much.

interpretation--the meaning.

reveal--tell something that is hidden.


- 1. Draw a face on the back of the spoon.
- 2. Twist a bag-closer around the spoon where the handle meets the spoon. This makes arms.
- 3. Cut a piece of cloth 2 inches wide by 6 inches long.

 Cut a small hole in the center of the cloth and slip

 it over the head of the spoon. Half of the cloth is
 folded down behind and half in front to form the
 clothes (robe).
- 4. A little above the center of the robe, tie snugly with string, thread, or a narrow strip of cloth to give the person shape.
- 5. Cut a small square of contrasting colored cloth about 3 inches square. Fold down one corner less than half way. Glue it to the spoon above the face.
- For men use another bag-closer or a strip of cloth to tie around the head in the manner in which the men of Bible times did.
- 7. To make the people stand up, cut tiny slits in a cardboard box (shoe box, cracker box, cereal box). Cover the box with plain paper. Cut the slits so the people can be arranged to look like they are talking to one another. Slip the end of the spoon into the slit just far enough to make it stand. OR instead of a box, you can make a clay base for each spoon person.
- 8. Each student should make 12 men to represent the 12 sons of Jacob. Dress each one differently. As the story progresses, dress Joseph in clothes that fit his condition.





SECTION 2 -- EXODUS

This is Section 2 of a two-part series studying Genesis and Exodus.

The lessons for Exodus are numbered consecutively after the final lesson of Genesis #47 because the events in Exodus continue the history of the children of Israel.

Section 2 -- Exodus is divided into Parts 6, 7, and 8.

All material for this course is based on the New King James Version.

The packet for Section 2 -- Exodus -- includes:

Patterns and instructions for projects--one for each of the 3 Parts.

A Game.

Visual Aids for Exodus

Accordion Book

Continue adding to the Accordion Book of Genesis. With the first lesson of Exodus, add the page that says, "430 Years," explaining that many years had gone by since the death of Joseph until the book of Exodus begins.

Map

Make an enlarged copy of the map enclosed. Each student should have a smaller copy so they can follow the travels of the Israelites.

Model Tabernacle

For Part 8 of Exodus, make a simple model tabernacle. Mount the pictures of the pieces of furniture. Back them with light cardboard. Make stands for each piece and place them in a cardboard box that you have divided into two parts with a piece of cloth. Set this smaller box in a much larger box that has the sides cut down to represent the walls of the court. Place the altar of sacrifice and the laver in the correct places in the court.

A New Game

A new kind of game for reviewing the book of Exodus. As time permits throughout the study, have the students work on coloring and mounting their games. The game can be played in shortened form in the review lessons for Part 6 and Part 7. The board is marked to show where to stop.

Game Purpose: The squares contain the events of Exodus in order. The repetition of reading the squares as the game progresses helps to re-enforce the events in the minds of the students. (If a student can not read, another player can read for him while he listens carefully.)

How to make the Game:

- 1. This game contains a board, a spinner and markers. Each student should make a game.
- 2. The pictures should be colored. The blocks may also be colored but be careful not to color

the words so that they cannot be read.

- 3. When the coloring is complete, paste the two parts of the game board to pieces of light cardboard. On the back, paste a strip of paper over the crack between the cardboard pieces in such a way that the game can be folded when not in use.
- 4. The parts of the spinner and the markers are on the Extra Things for Worksheets Older, and Extra Things for Worksheets Younger, page 2. Glue them to light cardboard.
- 5. Use a brad to fasten the arrow to the spinner base. Cut out the hole in the spinner board so that the arrow can spin freely. Bend the prongs of the brad loosely. Color each marker a different color.
- 6. Markers can be cut out of cardboard or use buttons. Each marker or button must be a different color.

Rules for the Game:

- 1. The game is played by 2, 3, or 4 people.
- 2. The first person spins the arrow. He then counts with his marker the number of spaces that the arrow points to. He should read what each square says as he touches it. If the marker stops on a square that has instructions, the player must do what it says.
- 3. The second person does the same thing. The turns go around the game board, one by one.
- 4. The first person to get to the last square wins the game.

Verses

Each lesson has an identifying verse or verses. These should be memorized whenever possible. At the very least they should be read from the worksheet and identified with the large visualized picture on the accordion book during the lesson.

Projects for Exodus

- Part 6 -- A small basket with a baby.
- Part 7 -- Ten Commandments Tablets.
- Part 8 -- A scroll with some of the laws that God gave Israel.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Read all the chapters included for each PART before you begin to prepare the first lesson of that Part. This will give you a more comprehensive idea of what is happening. Remember it is a continuing story, not just separate events. There sometimes is overlapping in the lessons. Having read all the chapters will help you to make the proper divisions.

PART 6 -- MOSES EN EGYPT Read Exodus, Chapters 1 through 13.

Be sure to relate Exodus to Genesis, showing that it is a continuation of the story after hundreds of years have passed.

Lesson: 48

Story: Moses' Birth -- Exodus 1:1 to 2:10.

Application: God cares about what happens to us.

Study Helps: Remind the students that in the New King James Version when you see LORD it

means that the Hebrew has the name of God which is "Jehovah" in the Old Testament. LORD has been used in these lessons where it occurs in the text. In the New Testament God is called (See Psalm 105:24-41; 78:43-53 about the events in Exodus.) "Father."

Pharaoh -- the name for the king of Egypt. Explain:

midwives -- women who help a mother when a baby is born.

ark -- a basket made to float in water.

bulrushes -- tall, slender reed-like plants that grew along the Nile River.

asphalt and pitch -- sticky substances that would keep water from getting into the basket.

daubed -- smeared or coated the bulrushes that ark was made of.

descendant -- a person's child, grandchild, great-grandchild, etc.

rigor -- strictly, harshly.

Related scriptures: Acts 7:20-23; Hebrews 11:23.

Visual Aids: The accordion book continues. Begin Exodus with paper on which is written "430 years." This shows how many years passed between the last story of Genesis and the beginning of Exodus (see Exodus 12:40,41). The pictures for Exodus are much simpler, just an important person, animal or object. The picture for Lesson 48--basket.

Older: Map "Where It All Happened in Exodus": Each student should have a copy.

Locate Egypt, Goshen, Pithom, Raamses (Rameses).

Verse: Memorize the verse that goes with the picture of the lesson.

Exodus 2:10: "The child grew, and she brought him to Pharaoh's daughter, and he became her son. So she called his name Moses."

Worksheet: Younger: Color by number. 1=brown; 2=green; 3=blue.

Project: Part 6 -- a small basket with a baby. See Projects page 1 for pieces and instructions.

Lesson: 49

Story: Moses Flees from Egypt -- Exodus 2:11-25.

Application: Doing things our own way without checking what God says is not good. Today we know what God says by reading the Bible.

Study Helps: Related scriptures: Acts 7:23-29; Hebrews 11:24-27.

Be prepared with more ideas for the "Talk About:" section on the worksheet.

Visual Aids: The accordion book.

Map -- "Where It All Happened in Exodus": locate the general area of Midian.

Verse: Exodus 2:15--"Moses fled from the face of Pharaoh and dwelt in the land of Midian."

Worksheet: Younger: Patterns for stones and water are on Patterns for Worksheets Younger, page 1. Teacher cuts out stones of gray or tan paper and the water of blue paper ahead of class. Students paste the stone first, then the water. Draw lines for the stones. Color the rest of well.

Older: Prepare the small pictures on Extra Things for Worksheets Older so the students can paste them in the correct order on their worksheets. (Order: born; sees; Egyptian beats Israeli; Moses kills Egyptian; buries Egyptian; two Israelis fight; two Israelis talk to Moses; Moses flees; comes to well; waters sheep; meets Jethro; marries.)

Project: Continue the work on the basket with a baby.

Lesson: 50

Story: The Burning Bush -- Exodus 3:1 to 4:17.

Application: God does not want us to make excuses when we are asked to do something.

Study Helps: Related scripture: Acts 7;30-34.

Explain: bush -- not known exactly what kind, perhaps a plant with thorns.

Be prepared to use the "Talk About" section on the worksheet.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Older: Map "Where It All Happened in Exodus": Have them mark on their copy of the map where Moses was when he saw the burning bush.

Verse: Exodus 3:2--"The Angel of the LORD appeared to him in a flame of fire from the midst of a bush...the bush was burning with fire, but the bush was not consumed."

Younger: Color by number. 1 is red; 2 is green; 3 is brown. Worksheet:

Lesson: 51

Story: Moses Returns to Egypt -- Exodus 4:18-23, 27-31.

Application: We must obey God's commands even if they are difficult.

Study Helps: Read God's Plan in Egypt (an enclosed article) which gives an in-depth analysis. Refer to it during Lessons 51 through 61 to understand and be able to explain what God was planning, Pharaoh's actions, and the results.

Related scripture: Acts 7:35-38.

Explain: elder -- an older man. Among the Israelites, older men were considered leaders and advisers.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Verse: Exodus 4:20-- Then Moses...returned to the land of Egypt. And Moses took the rod of God in his hand.

Worksheet: Younger: Teacher cut around Moses' hand. Student pastes small stick over the rod in his hand. Paste serpent (Extra Things for Worksheets, page 1) in the box that says: "What the rod turned into when Moses threw it down."

Older: Students draw the elders listening to Moses and Aaron.

Lesson: 52

Story: Pharaoh Makes Life Difficult -- Exodus 5:1-21.

Application: When there are disappointments in life, we should not get discouraged but we should depend on God's promises.

Study Helps: Refer to article God's Plan in Egypt.

Explain: taskmaster -- a harsh person who is in charge of a group of workers.

abhorrent -- detestable, hateful.

Be prepared to use the "Talk About" section on the worksheet.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

<u>Verse:</u> Exodus 5:23--"Since I came to Pharaoh to speak in Your name [*LORD*], he has done evil to this people."

Worksheet: Younger: Patterns for Pharaoh's crown and shoes are on Patterns for Worksheets Younger, page 1. Before class the teacher cuts crowns and shoes from gold paper. Students paste.

Older: After the students have found out what the picture is, have them paste cardboard pieces on the bricks to make them seem more real.

Project: If you have not finished the baby and the basket, continue to work.

Lesson: 53

Story: The LORD Promises Freedom -- Exodus 5:22 to 6:13; and 6:28 to 7:7.

Application: God promises things but He has His own way of keeping His promises. Just because He delays does not mean He will not keep them.

Study Helps: Refer to the article: God's Plan in Egypt.

Explain: pilgrimage -- a long and difficult journey.

<u>freedom</u> -- In this case, God is promising that the Israelites would not be slaves to the Egyptians anymore.

<u>bondage</u>--slavery (owned by another person; have no freedom to do what you want to do. heritage -- that which comes down to a person from the family before you.

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

<u>Verse:</u> Exodus 6:1; 7:2 -- The LORD said to Moses, "Now you shall see what I will do to Pharaoh. For with a strong hand he will let them go, and with a strong hand he will drive them out of his land...You shall speak all that I command you. And Aaron your brother shall speak to Pharaoh to send the children of Israel out of his land."

Worksheet: Younger: Use raveled gray yarn to make hair and beard on Aaron.

Lesson: 54

Story: The LORD Sends the Plague of Blood -- Exodus 7:6-25.

Application: God knows ahead of time what is going to happen. He knew that Pharaoh was going to say, "No." We can and must respect God because He knows everything.

Study Helps: Refer to the article: God's Plan in Egypt.

The Nile River was a god to the Egyptians.

Explain: enchantments -- secret arts, spells, a form of witchcraft.

Where was the plaque?

water turned to blood (7:19) -- "the waters of Egypt...their streams...their rivers... their ponds, and...all their pools of water, that they may become blood... throughout all the land of Egypt, both in buckets of wood and pitchers of stone."

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Pictures of modern day Egypt, especially the Nile River.

Verse: Exodus 7:20-- "And all the waters that were in the river were turned to blood.". "

Memory: Give each student his copy of the <u>10 Plagues</u> to take home to memorize. Put another copy in each student's folder. Give a gold star to each student when they can repeat them from memory.

Worksheet: Younger: Color the water red. Also make red water on the ground.

Lesson: 55

Story: The LORD Sends the Plagues of Frogs, Lice, and Flies -- Exodus 8.

Application: Our LORD God has more power than any other gods.

Study Helps: Refer to the article: God's Plan in Egypt.

Halley's Bible Handbook in the topic "The Religion of Egypt" tells us some of the gods of the Egyptians--bull, cow, vulture, falcon (sky god); hawk (Ra the sun god); crocodile (Satan); goat (Osaris, god of the dead); ape (god of intelligence); frog, serpent, and many other gods. Their gods took the form of animals. Also they worshipped the sun. In the temples the Egyptian priests cared for these animal gods by feeding and grooming them in a most luxurious way. The most sacred god was the bull before which they burned incense and made sacrifices. When the bull died it was given a funeral and burial as for a king. The crocodile was also greatly honored. The plagues that God sent on Egypt along with Moses' rod turning into a serpent were directed against the gods of Egypt. Read Exodus 12:12!

Explain:

<u>plague</u> -- something bad that happens to many people at the same time over a wide area. <u>magician</u> -- a person who by the power of Satan does some strange and wonderful things.

Where were the plagues?

The plagues were over such a large area that there could be no doubt that each was a miracle that only the LORD God could perform.

 $\underline{\text{frogs}}$ (8:3) -- "into your house, into your bedroom, on your bed, into the houses of your servants, on your people, into your ovens, and into your kneading bowls."

lice (8:17) -- "on man and beast... throughout all the land of Egypt."

flies (8:21,22,24) -- "on you and your servants, on your people and into your houses. The houses of the Egyptians shall be full of swarms of flies, and also the ground on which they stand... set apart the land of Goshen, in which My people dwell, that no swarms of flies shall be there... Thick swarms of flies came into the house of Pharaoh, into his servants' houses, and into all the land of Egypt. The land was corrupted because of the swarms of flies."

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Pictures of frogs, lice and flies.

The enlarged picture in this packet of the 10 plagues.

<u>Verse:</u> Exodus 8:6,17,24--Aaron stretched out his hand... frogs came up...Aaron struck the dust...and it became lice... Thick swarms of flies came... into all the land of Egypt.

Memory: Check to see who can repeat the Plagues.

Worksheet: Younger: Frogs, lice, and flies are on Extra Things for Worksheets Younger, page 1. Teacher cuts them out ahead of time along with the small strips of paper to make springs. In class, students fold the strips; paste one end to the frog or lice or fly. Paste the other end of the spring to the back of the same frog or lice or fly. This gives a shadow effect.

Lesson: 56

Story: The LORD Sends Plagues of Pestilence, Boils, and Hail on Livestock -- Exodus 9

Application: To be stubborn and rebellious against God is sin.

Study Helps: Refer to God's Plan in Egypt.

Explain; livestock -- cattle, horses, donkeys, camels, oxen, and sheep

boil -- bad infected and painful sores.

hail -- balls of ice that fall from the sky during a thunder storm.

Be prepared to use the "Talk About" section on the worksheet.

Where did the plagues occur and not occur?

pestilence -- (9:3,4) "on your cattle in the field, on the horses, on the donkeys, on the camels, on the oxen, and on the sheep--a very severe pestilence...on the livestock of Egypt. So nothing shall die of all that belongs to the children of Israel."

boils -- (9:9) "sores on man and beast throughout all the land of Egypt."

hail -- (9:22-26) "throughout the whole land of Egypt, all that was in the field, both man and beast; and the hail struck every herb of the field and broke every tree of the field. Only in the land of Goshen, where the children of Israel were, there was no hail."

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Pictures of cattle.

Verse: Exodus 9:6,10,23-- All the livestock of Egypt died... dust caused boils that break out in sores on man and beast ...the LORD sent thunder, hail, and fire on the land of Egypt.

Younger: Color the pictures. Worksheet:

Lesson: 57

Story: The LORD Sends the Plagues of Locusts and Darkness -- Exodus 10.

Application: God punishes sin.

Study Helps: Refer to the article: God's Plan in Egypt.

Explain: sacrifice -- an offering of some material object belonging to the person offering it for the purpose of pleasing God and receiving His favor.

burnt offering -- A whole animal is burned on the altar as a sacrifice for the forgiveness of sin and to dedicate the person to following the LORD.

locusts -- insects like grasshoppers that fly and eat any green growing thing.

thick darkness -- the darkness was miraculous-- "they did not see one another; nor did anyone rise from his place for three days."

Where did the plagues occur and not occur?

locusts -- (10:4-6, 14-15) "cover the ... earth, so that no one will be able to see the earth; and...shall fill your houses, the houses of all your servants, and the houses of all the Egyptians... over all the land of Egypt and rested on all the territory of Egypt. ...the land was darkened; and they ate every herb of the land and all the fruit of the trees which the hail had left. So there remained nothing green on the trees or on the plants of the field throughout all the land of Egypt."

darkness -- (10:21-23) "over the land of Egypt, darkness which may even be felt...thick darkness in all the land of Egypt three days. They did not see one another; nor did anyone rise from his place for three days. But all the children of Israel had light in their dwellings."

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Pictures of locusts and grasshoppers.

Verse: Exodus 10:14,22-- The locusts went up over all the land of Egypt... and ate all which the hail left...Moses stretched out his hand and there was thick darkness in all Egypt three days.

Worksheet: Younger: Color the right hand box solid black.

Lesson: 58

Story: The Passover -- Exodus 11:1 to 12:30; and 12:43 to 13:16.

Application: Complete obedience to God's commands is important. It can mean whether a person is saved or not.

Study Helps: NOTE: This lesson overlaps with Lesson 60. Be sure that the emphasis on this

Lesson 58 is about the Passover and how it was celebrated the first time and was to be kept in the years to come. Related scripture: Heb. 11:28. The missing verses in chapter 12 will be covered in a later lesson.

Explanation for the Passover celebration: Exodus 13:13-14 -- "And all the firstborn of man among your sons you shall redeem. So it shall be, when your son asks you in time to come, saying, 'What is this?' that you shall say to him, 'By strength of hand the LORD brought us out of Egypt, out of the house of bondage."

Christians do not celebrate the Jewish Passover because Jesus died on the cross and became our Passover lamb (I Cor. 5:7).

Explain: consecrate -- to set apart as holy.

blemish -- any kind of scar, deformed or sickly part.

twilight -- the time of day between day and night when it is beginning to get a little dark. leavening -- the substance that makes any kind of bread to rise, such as yeast, baking powder.

convocation -- an assembly that people are called to attend.

plunder -- prize or gain of war.

lintel -- crosspiece at top of a door.

The following 3 words are basically interchangeable.

ordinance -- an order, command made by authority (God).

law -- a rule given by authority (God).

command -- and order by authority which must be obeyed. "as the LORD commanded Moses and Aaron so they did." (12:50)

Where did the plague occur and not occur?

death of the firstborn (11:4,5) -- "About midnight I will go out into the midst of Egypt; and all the firstborn in the land of Egypt shall die, from the firstborn of Pharaoh who sits on his throne, even to the firstborn of the female servant who is behind the handmill, and all the firstborn of the animals."

(11:22,23) -- "you [Israelites] shall take a bunch of hyssop, dip it in the blood that is in the basin, and strike the lintel and the two doorposts with the blood that is in the basin. And none of you shall go out of the door of his house until morning. For the LORD will pass through to strike the Egyptians; and when He sees the blood on the lintel and on the two doorposts, the LORD will pass over the door and not allow the destroyer to come into your houses to strike you."

Visual Aids: Accordion book.

Pictures of sheep, especially lambs.

A sample of unleavened bread (flour, water, oil, mixed and cooked in a frying pan.) Let the students taste it. Then let them taste biscuit or loaf bread which contain leavening to see the difference.

Verse: Exodus 12:27,29-- It is the Passover sacrifice of the LORD, who passed over the houses of the children of Israel in Egypt...at midnight that the LORD struck all the firstborn in the land of Egypt.

Memory: Check to see who can repeat the Plagues.

Worksheet: Younger: Color the blood on the door red. Cut 3 sides of the door so it can be opened. On the back of the paper, carefully paste the scene found on Extra Things for Worksheets Younger, page 1 to show what the Israelites had to do at the Passover.

Project: Be sure the baby and basket project are finished.

Lesson: 59

Review of Part 6.

<u>Worksheet:</u> Younger: Talk about each picture in the Accordion Book, asking questions for the students to answer and tell the stories.

Older -- The worksheet contains 2 shaped crossword puzzles with clues to be followed in order to fill in the correct words. In some cases a letter from one word is also a letter for another word. Those spaces have darker lines around them. To fill in the words, students follow the tiny arrows. Use the word list to find the answers. All the texts in the clues are from Exodus.

PART 7 -- THE ISRAELITES LEAVE EGYPT Read Exodus, Chapters 12 through 20.

Lesson: 60

Story: The Israelites Leave Egypt -- 12:31-42 and 13:17-22.

Application: God keeps His promises.

<u>Study Helps:</u> Refer to *God's Plan in Egypt*. This Lesson overlaps with Lesson 58. Use a review of #58 as the background of this Lesson 60.

Related scriptures: Psalm 105:26-39

Explain: leavening-something put into bread to make it rise. (12:34)

Visual Aids: The accordion book.

<u>Verse:</u> Exodus 12:40,41-- The children of Israel... all the armies of the LORD went out from the land of Egypt.

<u>Worksheet:</u> Paste bits of cotton on the cloud. Use red marker to color the fire. Have the students paste cotton over one column and red paper on the other.

<u>Project:</u> Part 7 -- Ten commandments tablets. See instructions on Projects, pages 2 and 3. Emphasize that the Sabbath was given to the Israelites only, not to Christians. See Lesson 66.

Lesson 61

Story: The Red Sea -- Exodus 14:1 to 15:21.

Application: God has power over everything, including the sea.

Study Helps: Refer to God's Plan in Egypt.

Related scripture Psalm 106:7-12; Hebrews 11:29; Psalm 78:12-14.

Explain: <u>column</u>--a post or a pillar that holds up the roof of a building. The cloud that lead the Israelites was shaped like a column.

Visual Aids: The accordion book.

Map--Older students find the route the Israelites took to cross the Red Sea on their maps.

<u>Verse:</u> Exodus 14:22-- So the children of Israel went into the midst of the sea on the dry ground, and the waters were a wall to them on their right hand and on their left.

<u>Worksheet:</u> Younger: Color the path through the sea brown. Color the water blue. Scotch tape plastic wrap over the water. <u>Older:</u> After they color the water blue, have the students scotch tape plastic wrap over the water to make it look more realistic.

Story: The Israelites Complain -- Exodus 15:22 to 16:36.

Application: We should give thanks instead of complaining.

Study Helps: Related scriptures: Psalm 105:40; Psalm 106:13-15; Psalm 78:17-19, 21-31.

Explain: murmur--to complain.

wilderness--a place of sand and rocks where there are almost no plants or water.

manna--means "What?" in Hebrew.

homer--a measure of 4 dry pints. Dry pints are 1/6th larger than liquid pints.

ephah--a measure of 3/5th of a bushel.

statute--a law, a permanent rule, decree, edict by a ruler. Another word that is interchangeable with law, ordinance, and command. See Lesson Helps #58.

Visual Aids: The accordion book.

Pictures of quail.

<u>Verse:</u> Exodus 16:2--Then the whole congregation of the children of Israel complained against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness.

Worksheet: Younger: Paste small feathers on the quail; bits of cracker on the manna.

Older: Be prepared to use the "Talk about" section of the worksheet. The small pictures of manna and quail to paste are on Extra Things for Worksheets Older. One way to complete the pictures is to have the students paste a bit of cracker over the manna and a feather on the quail.

Story: Water From the Rock -- Exodus 17.

Application: Complaining is a sin against God.

Study Helps: Related scriptures: Psalm 78:15,16,20; Psalm 105:41

Visual Aids: The accordion book.

<u>Verse:</u> Exodus 17:3--The people thirsted there for water, and... complained against Moses... "Why is it you have brought us up out of Egypt, to kill us and our children...with thirst?."

Worksheet: Younger: Color the water blue. Tape plastic wrap over the water.

Project: Ten commandments tablets.

Lesson 64

Story: Jethro Visits Moses -- Exodus 18.

Application: We should be ready to listen to good advice.

Visual Aids: The accordion book.

<u>Verse:</u> Exodus 18:24,25-- Moses heeded the voice of his father-in-law and...chose able men...and made them heads over the people.

<u>Worksheet:</u> Younger: Pattern for Jethro's clothes are on Patterns for Worksheets Younger, page 1. Paste a bit of cotton for hair and a beard.

Older: Be prepared to use the "Talk about" section of the worksheet.

Project: Ten commandments tablets.

Lesson 65

Story: Israel Prepares to Receive the Ten Commandments -- Exodus 19:1 to 20:21.

Application: It is important to have great respect for God.

Study Helps: Lessons 65 and 66 overlap. As a part of this Lesson read the 10 commandments but do not discuss them. The next Lesson #66 is a study of the 10 commandments only. Lesson #67 is a study of the Sabbath.

Visual Aids: The accordion book.

. Map--find Mount Sinai.

<u>Verse:</u> Exodus 19:18-- Mount Sinai was completely in smoke, because the LORD descended upon it in fire.

<u>Worksheet:</u> Younger: Use brown, gray, or black to color the smoke covering Mount Sinai. Draw fire and rays of lightning on top of the mountain.

Memory: Distribute copies of the <u>10 Commandments</u> to the students to take home and learn. Another copy should be placed in their folder. When they can say the 10 commandments, give them a gold star on the folder copy.

Lesson 66

Story: The Ten Commandments -- Exodus 20:1-17.

Application: We still must obey 9 of the 10 commandments but not the one about the Sabbath.

<u>Study Helps:</u> This Lesson is a discussion of the 10 commandments and what they mean. An article *Nine of the Ten Commandments Are Repeated in the New Testament*, will be helpful for both this Lesson #66 and the Sabbath discussion for Lesson #67. In this lesson, only a brief mention that the Sabbath is not commanded in the New Testament is sufficient. Save a more detailed discussion for Lesson #67. Related scripture: Deut. 5.

Explain: false testimony -- to lie about what you have seen.

covet -- to want something very much that belongs to someone else.

Visual Aids: The accordion book.

Map--find Mount Sinai.

<u>Verse:</u> Exodus 20:1,2-- God spoke saying: "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage."

Worksheet: Younger: Items to paste are on Extra Things for Worksheets Younger, page 2. Paste 3 items in this order: #1--the fire on top of the mountain; #2--"GOD spoke saying"; #3--the words of God in the speech space. See the Accordion book page for Lesson 66 to see how it should look. <u>Teacher</u> should read the words and then have the students repeat as many of the 10 Commandments that they can.

Older: With lines, students connect the correct parts of the commands.

Memory: Check to see if anyone can say the 10 Commandments. Give gold stars if they can.

Project: Ten commandments tablets should be finished.

Lesson 67

Story: The Sabbath Laws -- Exodus 20:8-11; 23:12; 31:12-17; 34:21; 35:1-3.

Application: The Sabbath was a special day of rest given to the Israelites who are called Jews nowadays. Christians have Sunday as a special day to tell the world that Jesus is alive.

<u>Study Helps:</u> The enclosed article: Which Day Should We Keep: the Sabbath or Sunday? Related scripture: Deut. 5:12-15.

<u>Explain</u>: -- <u>children of Israel</u>, <u>tribes of Israel</u>, <u>Israel</u>, <u>Israelites</u> and <u>Jews</u> are all names for the same group of people.

-- which day of the week is the <u>Sabbath</u>--seventh (Exodus 20:10; Deut. 5:14). There is much religious confusion in which people call Sunday the Sabbath. Sunday is the first day of the week, not the seventh.

-- that according to the scriptures in this Lesson and others in the Bible, the Sabbath was given to the Israelites to keep.

The other 9 commandments are taught in the New Testament for Christians to obey (See the enclosed chart). Keeping the Sabbath is actually taught <u>against</u> in Colossians 2:16-17.

On <u>Sunday Christians</u> remember the death of Jesus and the fact that He arose on the first day of the week. There is no direct commandment in the New Testament for Christians to keep Sunday but we have the example of the earliest Christians doing so. See 1 Cor. 16:1,2; Acts 20:7.

Visual Aids: The accordion book.

<u>Verse:</u> Exodus 31:1,16,17-- The LORD spoke saying: "Israel shall keep the Sabbath...It is a sign between Me and the children of Israel forever."

<u>Worksheet:</u> Younger: After talking about the fact that Saturday is the Sabbath, the students color all the Saturday blocks with red. Then, color all the Sunday blocks yellow.

Lesson 69

Story: More Laws of God For Israel -- Exodus 20:22 to 23:33.

<u>Application:</u> God was interested in all parts of the life of the children of Israel. He also cares about our lives today.

<u>Study Helps:</u> This Lesson does not have a story but you can make it live by imagining life among the Israelites and the various things that could happen. What did God say they should do in various situations?

Explain: judgments — decisions made by an authority to be obeyed. In this case, by God. Used along with commandments, statutes, and laws all of which have somewhat the same meaning. See Helps for Lessons 58 and 62.

Visual Aids: The accordion book.

<u>Verse:</u> Exodus 20:22 and 21:1-- The LORD said to Moses, "Thus you shall say to the children of Israel...These are the judgments which you shall set before them."

Worksheet: Younger and Older: Paste the Hebrew words on the scroll on the worksheet. (Extra Things for Worksheets Younger, page 2; and Extra Things for Worksheets Older). The Hebrew is from Exodus 20:22 which say "And the LORD said unto Moses."

<u>Project:</u> Part 8 -- a scroll with some of the laws that God gave Israel. See laws to cut out and instructions on Projects, page 4. Emphasize that these laws were given to Israel.

Lesson 70

Story: Moses on Mount Sinai -- Exodus 24:1 to 31:18.

<u>Application:</u> Being a leader has privileges but it also has the responsibility of obeying God and leading the people in the right way.

Study Helps: Explain:

covenant can have several meanings:

- --a binding agreement, a contract between two or more people or nations to be friends. Ex. 23:32
- --most often means the law agreement between God and men. Ex. 24:7,8. God's covenant with Israel of the Old Testament included many more laws than the 10 commandments. testimony -- a testimony is a statement of fact or truth.
 - --In Exodus there are repeated references to "the <u>ark of Testimony</u>" (for example, Ex. 25:16). Later in other books of the Law of Moses, Testimony is used as a synonym with covenant "ark of the covenant" (Num. 10:33; Deut. 10:8).
 - --"Two tablets of the Testimony, tablets of stone" (Ex. 31:18) (Also later in the Law called the "tablets of the covenant" Deut 9:9,11,15.)
 - --"<u>Tabernacle of the Testimony</u>" (Ex. 38:21); also called tabernacle of the tent of meeting (Ex. 39:32)

<u>peace offering</u> -- giving God something of a person's own things to show he is at peace with God and to express thanks to Him.

Visual Aids: The accordion book.

Older: Map--find Mount Sinai.

<u>Verse:</u> Exodus 24:1-- The LORD said to Moses, "Come up to the LORD, you and Aaron, Nadab and Abihu, and seventy of the elders of Israel, and worship from afar."

Worksheet: Younger: First: paste Moses (Extra Things for Worksheets Younger, page 1) high up on Mount Sinai. Then, color the mountain brown and the sand below yellow.

Project: A scroll with some of the laws that God gave Israel.

Lesson 71

Story: The Golden Calf -- Exodus 32:1 to 33:6

Application: God hated idolatry during the time of the Israelites. He still hates it.

Study Helps: Related scripture: Psalm 106:19-23; Acts 7:39-41; 1 Corinthians 10:6-7,14.

Visual Aids: The accordion book.

<u>Verse:</u> Exodus 32:3,4-- Aaron... made a molded calf. Then they said, "This is your god, O Israel, that brought you out of the land of Egypt!"

<u>Worksheet:</u> <u>Younger:</u> Patterns for Worksheets Younger, page 2 for calf to cut out of yellow or gold paper for students to paste over the calf in the picture.

Project: A scroll with some of the laws that God gave Israel.

Lesson 72

Story: Moses and the Glory of the LORD -- Exodus 33:7-23

Application: In old times God spoke in a voice to people to tell them what He wanted them to know. Moses was a special person to whom God spoke many times. Today God speaks to us when we read the Bible.

Study Helps: Related scripture: Hebrews 1:1-2; 2 Peter 1:16-21; 2 Tim. 3:14-17.

Visual Aids: The accordion book.

Verse: Exodus 33:11-- The LORD spoke to Moses face to face, as a man speaks to his friend.

<u>Worksheet:</u> Younger: Pattern to make a cloth tent is on Patterns for Worksheets Younger, page 2. After pasting the cloth tent, paste cotton on the cloud so that it covers the front of the tent.

<u>Older:</u> Using the tent pattern on Extra Things for Worksheets Older, have the students cut the tent out of cloth to paste over the tent in the box on the worksheet. Also paste cotton over the entrance to represent the cloud.

Project: a scroll with some of the laws that God gave Israel.

Lesson 73

Story: Moses Receives Two New Tablets -- Exodus 34:1-35

Application: God listens to us when we pray to Him. He listened to Moses in a special way.

Visual Aids: The accordion book.

<u>Verse:</u> Exodus 34:1-- The LORD said to Moses, "I will write on these tablets the words that were on the first tablets which you broke."

Worksheet: Younger: Students write numbers 1-10 on the tablets.

Project: the scroll.

Lesson 74

Story: The Offering for the Tabernacle -- Exodus 25:1-9; 35:4 to 36:7; 38:24,25,29

Application: The way the Israelites gave offerings to make the tabernacle is a good example to us today.

Study Helps: Related scripture: 2 Corinthians 9:7.

Explain: sanctify -- to set apart for a holy purpose.

Visual Aids: The accordion book.

Pictures of the gem stones on which the names of the 12 tribes were engraved. The public library should have a book picturing all kinds of gems in color, or if you have access to an encyclopedia with color plates.

Verse: Exodus 35:20,21-- All the congregation of the children of Israel...whose heart was stirred, and everyone whose spirit was willing...brought the LORD 's offering for the work of the tabernacle.

Worksheet: Younger: Color the rolls of cloth with blue, purple, and scarlet (red).

Lesson 75

Story: Making the Tabernacle -- Exodus 36:8 to 38:31 (with chapters 25--27) and Making the Priest's Clothes -- 39:1-31 (with chapters 28--31).

<u>Application:</u> God gave the Israelites the exact plan of the special place and the special way to worship Him. Today we follow the commands and examples in the New Testament given to Christians.

Study Helps: Make this Lesson as interesting as possible. Don't talk about all the details of the measurements and decorations but do emphasize that God gave exact instructions. Try to help the students feel the excitement of making such a beautiful building exactly as God said. You might begin by asking them to name the things that are needed if someone is going to build a building (plans, materials, workers). Notice all the small utensils for use in the various activities of worship by the priests. Be sure they understand that the tabernacle was for the Israelites.

Christians do not need the tabernacle because God has given us a different way to worship Him today. For example, we don't make animal sacrifices because Jesus made the perfect sacrifice on the cross for us (See Heb. 9:24-28; 10:10-12). Christians do not have a special building in which worship has to be done but instead the Bible says that the Christian people together are God's building (1 Cor. 3:9, 16-17).

Explain: <u>cubit</u>--18 inches.

tabernacle--a tent-like moveable building in which the Israelites were to worship God. sanctuary--a sacred place. (This word is wrongly used now days of the auditorium where the Christians meet. The Christians' bodies are God's sanctuary. He lives in us, not in a building 1 Cor. 3:16,17.)

<u>priest</u>—the person who did the work of the tabernacle, especially making the sacrifices. <u>anoint</u>—to pour oil over his head to show that a person is to do some special work. <u>incense</u>—special herbs which when burned make a good odor.

cherubim--special heavenly beings similar to angels.

Visual Aids: The accordion book.

Enlarged pictures of the pieces of tabernacle furniture (in this packet).

Verse: Exodus 25:9-- The LORD said to Moses, "According to all that I show you...the pattern of the tabernacle and the pattern of all its furnishings, just so you shall make it."

<u>Worksheet:</u> <u>Younger:</u> Paste the furniture (Extra Things for Worksheets Younger, page 1) in the correct places on the tabernacle diagram.

Older: Prepare small pictures of the tabernacle furniture, found on the Extra Things for Worksheets Older, for students to paste in the correct places in the diagram on their Worksheet, Page 2.

Project: the scroll.

Lesson 76

Story: The Tabernacle Finished -- Exodus 39:32 to 40:38

Application: To please God we must do things according to his instructions.

<u>Study Helps:</u> When telling the story, <u>make sure</u> that you cover the items in the puzzle for Lesson 77. Background scriptures: Exodus 35:30 thru 39:31; Acts 7:44.

The Tabernacle was called "the tabernacle of the tent of meeting," "the tabernacle of meeting," "the tent of meeting," or just "the tabernacle," all referring to the same place.

Exodus 25:30 says "set the showbread on the table."; 35:13; 39:36 say only "showbread" along with the utensils for the table. Exodus does not tell us how much. Leviticus 24:5,6, which gives more details of the Law of Moses, says, "And you shall take fine flour and bake twelve cakes with it. Two-tenths of an ephah shall be in each cake. You shall set them in two rows, six in a row, on the pure gold table before the LORD."

Explain: minister (28:41; 30:30)--to serve.

Visual Aids: The accordion book.

The model Tabernacle (See instructions on page 2 of these helps.) As you tell the story, place each piece of tabernacle furniture in its place on a large chart or in the model that you have made.

<u>Verse:</u> Exodus 39:32-- All the work of the tabernacle of the tent of meeting was finished... according to all that the LORD had commanded Moses; so they did.

Worksheet: Younger: Color the picture.

Older: The answer to "as the LORD commanded" is 15 times; answer to "all that the LORD commanded" is 3 times.

Project: Should be finished.

SABBATH OR SUNDAY?

A very humanitarian idea: not only give your own body a day of rest every week, but also everybody else in your house. "You shall do no work: you, nor your son, nor your daughter, nor your manservant, nor your maidservant." Not only humanitarian, but spiritual: the seventh day rest is a reminder of God's rest on the seventh day. Thus it is a reminder of our Creator.

A day of rest -- the Sabbath -- the seventh day of each week. "The Sabbath was made for man" to be a physical and spiritual blessing to him. Does that mean it was/is for all men of all times? Is the Sabbath binding upon us today, some 3,500 years after the commandment was first given? Is the Sabbath supposed to be a reality in our lives today, or was it rather an Old Testament shadow of a better reality in Christ Jesus?

Some people think that Sunday is the "Christian Sabbath." However, Matthew 28:1 clarifies: "Now after the Sabbath, as the first day of the week began to dawn." Thus, in the Bible, after the Sabbath comes the first day. Any dictionary will tell us that Sunday is the first day of the week. Saturday is the seventh. In the Bible, therefore, the Sabbath is Saturday; never Sunday.

TO WHOM WAS THE SABBATH GIVEN?

To find out which men had to keep the Sabbath, we must turn to the Old Testament. In Genesis 2:1-3, God indeed "blessed the seventh day and sanctified it." However, nowhere in Genesis does God command anyone to keep the Sabbath.

The first time in the Bible that "Sabbath" is mentioned is Exodus 16:23-36. Verse 29 says, "For Jehovah has given you the Sabbath." Who is "you"? "The house of Israel," whom God had brought "out of the land of Egypt" (verses 31,32).

About two weeks later, the ten commandments were given. Note the introduction: "I am Jehovah your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt" (Exodus 20:2). The fourth command of the ten (20:8-11) gives the well-known reason for resting on the Sabbath: "For in six days Jehovah made the heavens and the earth . . . and rested the seventh day."

In the parallel text of the ten commandments, another reason is given. "Remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt, and that Jehovah your God brought you out from there by a mighty hand and by an outstretched arm; therefore Jehovah your God commanded you to keep the Sabbath day" (Deuteronomy 5:15).

Later God said: "The children of Israel shall keep the Sabbath, to observe the Sabbath throughout their generations. . . . It is a sign between Me and the children of Israel forever" (Exodus 31:16,17). So when Mark 2:27 says "The Sabbath was made for man," the statement does not refer to all men. Rather, it refers to the men of Israel, to whom the commandment was given and to whom Jesus was speaking at that moment.

THE SABBATH WAS NAILED TO THE CROSS

Colossians 2:14 says of "the handwriting of requirements," that Christ "has taken it out of the way, having nailed it to the cross." Verse 16 gives examples of some of those things contained in the handwriting that were nailed to the cross. Among the items listed is "Sabbaths." Colossians thus powerfully teaches that Christ took away the commandment to keep the seventh day of the week. Christ nailed the fourth commandment to the cross, along with all the rest of the law.

Hebrews 4:9 says "There remains therefore a rest for the people of God." But the rest that remains for the Christian today is not a commandment (of the seventh day or of any other day). Rather, according to 4:1: "a promise remains of entering His rest."

The rest for the Christian today is not a commandment, but a promise. The wicked will "have no rest day or night." But as for the righteous: "Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord. . . . that they may rest from

their labors" (Revelation 14:11,13). See also Matthew 11:28-30. The seventh day rest was a shadow. The reality will be our eternal rest with Christ Jesus! Praise His Name!

IS SUNDAY "THE LORD'S DAY"?

Where does the expression "the Lord's Day" come from? Does it refer to Saturday or to Sunday? What importance did the day Sunday have in the church of the first century? Was it an ordinary day? Or was it a special day? What meaning does Sunday have in each of our personal lives today?

RESURRECTION DAY

On what day of the week did Jesus rise from the dead? Some people are confused because Saturday and Sunday are often called the "weekend," making Monday the first day of the "work week." But, from the time of the Roman Empire until the 20th century, Sunday has been and is the first day of the week. Just check your English dictionary.

Jesus often prophesied that after his death, he would "be raised again the third day" (Matthew 16:21; Luke 18:33). Not the third day of the week, but the third day from his crucifixion. What day of the week did this "third day" fall on?

Luke 24 tells of events "on the first day of the week" (verse 1). Verse 13 says two disciples were walking to Emmaus "that same day." After they mention Jesus' death, the disciples add: "today is the third day since these things happened" (verse 21). Verses 7 and 46 mention the prophecy Jesus had made "to rise from the dead the third day." Combining all five verses, we have irrefutable proof that the third day from the crucifixion was the first day of the week. Jesus rose on Sunday!

Matthew 28:1-8 and Mark 16:1-8 are parallel texts in which Mary Magdalene and other women visit the tomb around dawn "the first day of the week." On the way, they discussed who would roll away the stone, so they could anoint Jesus' body. As Matthew reads, one can only conclude that Jesus rose from the dead precisely while the women were on their way. When they got to the tomb, the angel told them: "He is not here; for He is risen." Mark adds: "He rose early on the first day of the week" (verse 9). Jesus rose the first day of the week: Sunday.

All history pivots around what took place that glorious Sunday. Jesus came out of the tomb never to die again. He did save Himself! He did it in a way far more powerful, glorious and meaningful than "simply" coming down from the cross. Neither the tomb nor Hades, itself, could hold Him! Jesus conquered death, sin and Satan. This Good News has been proclaimed around the world for almost 2,000 years! Jesus is not dead! He lives! It happened on Sunday.

"THE LORD'S DAY"

The apostle John says he received Revelation "on the Lord's Day" (Revelation 1:10). What day did he mean? There are three possibilities to consider: 1) Saturday (the Sabbath), 2) the Judgment Day, and 3) Sunday (the first day of the week).

As for the first possibility, Jesus was in fact the Lord of the Sabbath while He walked this earth. But John received the Revelation 65 years after the death of Jesus. Jesus in his death "wiped out the handwriting of requirements. . . . having nailed it to the cross" (Colossians 2:14). A few examples of those requirements are given two verses later. Among others are the "Sabbaths." Jesus nailed them all to the cross! After that, the Sabbath could no longer be the Lord's Day.

As for the second possibility, various times in the New Testament, "the day of the Lord" refers to the Second Coming of Christ. But in Revelation 1:10, John says "I was in the Spirit on the Lord's Day." Since he is speaking in the past, he cannot be speaking of the Second Coming, which even today is yet in the future.

This leaves only one possibility. John meant that he received the Revelation on Sunday. Sunday is the day on which the Lord Jesus Christ triumphed over all the forces of the evil one, rising from the dead. Sunday is the day He proved He is Lord. The first day of the week is, indeed, "the Lord's Day"!

Both the Romans of old and we in English today commonly call the first day of the week "Sun-Day". Not so in Spanish. In Spanish the first day of the week is called "Domingo," which, coming from the Latin, means "the day of the Lord"!

The Lord's church and His New Testament became a reality on Sunday. It was at the Jewish feast of Pentecost (Acts 2). This feast was set by counting "fifty days to the day after the seventh Sabbath" (Leviticus 23:16). The day after any Sabbath is the first day of the week. So, Pentecost fell on Sunday. Not only did Jesus rise from the dead on Sunday, but He started His Church on Sunday. It is the Lord's Day.

DID THE CATHOLIC CHURCH CHANGE THE SABBATH TO SUNDAY?

Sabbath keepers reject these arguments for Sunday. They claim the early Christians kept the Sabbath. They say the Catholic Church and the Emperor Constantine started worship on Sunday in the Fourth Century. Is that true?

Did the Catholic Church initiate the observance of Sunday? Roman Catholic sources can certainly be found which make that claim. But, we must understand what the Catholic Church means when it says that it changed Saturday to Sunday.

The Official Baltimore Catechism, Number 3, published in 1949, under question #235, says "The early Church changed the day of worship from Saturday to Sunday on the authority given to it by Christ. The New Testament makes no explicit mention that the apostles changed the day of worship, but we know it from Tradition."

According to this Catholic Catechism, it was the early church that changed the day of worship to Sunday. In fact, so early, that it was the apostles of Christ themselves who effected the change. Who can argue with the apostles?

The Roman Church, of course, claims to have been founded by Christ. But, Sabbath keepers agree with us that the Catholic Church did not exist in the first century. Since the Roman Catholic church did not exist when the change took place, then certainly the Roman Catholic church did not make the change.

And what about the claim that the Emperor Constantine, in 321 A.D., instituted Sunday as a day of rest? Yes, he did. But this is a very different matter from instituting Sunday as a day of worship.

The Encyclopedia Britannica, Eleventh Edition, in the article on Sunday, mentions "a constitution of Constantine in 321 A.D., enacting that all courts of justice, inhabitants of towns, and workshops were to be at rest on Sunday." What does the decree establish? That all "should rest on Sunday."

Constantine, for the first time in history, legalized Sunday as a day of rest. This was his idea of how to help the Christians to do what they had already been practicing for three centuries: assembling for worship on Sundays.

SUNDAY IS THE LORD'S DAY

Sunday is the day our Lord rose from the dead. Sunday is the day the Lord's Church began. Sunday is the day the Lord's Supper is eaten (Acts 20:7). Sunday is the day the Lord's people give to help others (1 Cor. 16:1-3). Sunday, in a word, is the Lord's day.

The true church remembers the death and resurrection of Christ 52 times a year. It has done so for 2,000 years! It will continue to do so till He comes!

If Jesus is your Lord, you will gather with the Lord's Church to partake of the Lord's Supper every single Lord's Day.

NINE OF THE TEN COMMANDMENTS ARE REPEATED IN THE NEW TESTAMENT

How could the ten commandments be done away? Is it all right today to steal, to murder, to disobey parents? Of course not. Nine of "the ten" are repeated in the New Testament. Some are repeated in identical words, while others are found in synonymous expressions. The ten commandments themselves are found in Exodus 20 and Deuteronomy 5. In the box following they are shown in abbreviated form.

The fourth commandment of "the ten" is not commanded in the New Testament. Jesus, indeed, living under the law, kept the Sabbath. He also corrected some false concepts held in his day regarding the Sabbath. But there is no record of Jesus ever commanding anybody to keep the Sabbath. Nor did the Apostles ever command it. Today we must obey nine of "the ten," not because they were in "the ten," but because they are a part of the New Covenant.

GOD'S PLAN IN EGYPT

All scriptures are in Exodus unless otherwise indicated.

- --To deliver Israel from the oppression of the Egyptians and take them to the land He had promised. (3:7-9)
- --God knew Pharaoh would not let Israel go, so He would strike Egypt with His wonders so Pharaoh would let Israel go. (3:19-20; 7:14)
- --God raised up Pharaoh so that He could show His power in him and that His name would be declared in all the earth. (9:16)
- --To bring "great judgments" on Egypt and their gods. (6:6; 7:4; 12:12)
- --To multiply His signs and wonders. (3:20; 7:3; 11:9)
- --To show Pharaoh and Israel who He was (9:13-14; 10:1-2).
- --To harden Pharaoh's heart (4:21).

Why God Hardened Pharaoh's Heart

- (4:21) "When you go back to Egypt, see that you do all those wonders before Pharaoh which I have put in your hand. But I will harden his heart, so that he will not let the people go."
- (7:3-5) "I will harden Pharaoh's heart, and multiply My signs and My wonders in the land of Egypt. But Pharaoh will not heed you, so that I may lay My hand on Egypt and bring My armies and My people, the children of Israel, out of the land of Egypt by great judgments. And the Egyptians shall know that I am the LORD, when I stretch out My hand on Egypt and bring out the children of Israel from among them."
 - (10:1,2) "I have hardened his [Pharaoh's] heart and the hearts of his servants, that I may show these signs of Mine before him and that you may tell in the hearing of your son and your son's son the mighty things I have done in Egypt, and My signs which I have done among them, that you may know that I am the LORD."
 - (11:9-10) The LORD said to Moses, "Pharaoh will not heed you, so that My wonders may be multiplied in the land of Egypt." So Moses and Aaron did all these wonders before Pharaoh; and the LORD hardened Pharaoh's heart, and he did not let the children of Israel go out of his land.
 - (14:4,8,17) "I will harden Pharaoh's heart, so that he will pursue them; and I will gain honor over Pharaoh and over all his army, that the Egyptians may know that I am the Lord."

God gave Pharaoh many opportunities to repent but instead he hardened his own heart.

"How long will you refuse to humble yourself before Me?" (10:3)

- Pharaoh was given warnings and the opportunity to either let Israel go or suffer the consequences. He chose to say, "No" each time.
- Many times God mercifully removed the plagues but although Pharaoh said he would let Israel go if the plague were removed, he backed down and said, "No."
- Once God even allowed Pharaoh to set the time of the removal of the plague but it did not result in his repentance (8:10,15).
- Another time Pharaoh said, "I have sinned this time. The LORD is righteous, and my people and I are wicked." But as soon as the plague of hail was removed the Bible says: "he sinned yet more; and he hardened his heart, he and his servants." (9:27,34)
- At the time of the plague of locusts Pharaoh said: "I have sinned against the LORD your God and against you. Now therefore, please forgive my sin only this once, and entreat the LORD your God, that He may take away from me this death only." (10:16,17) But as soon as the plague was taken away he did not let Israel go.
- When a person sets himself against God even God's mercies result in more hardening. The same sun that melts wax also hardens clay.

God Tried to Show Pharaoh Who He Was

- Pharaoh said, "I do not know the LORD," (5:2) when Moses and Aaron first asked for Israel to leave.
 - God told Moses: "The Egyptians shall know that I am the LORD, when I stretch out My hand on Egypt and bring out the children of Israel from among them." (7:5)
 - God said "By this you [Pharaoh] shall know I am the LORD," along with the plague of water into blood that He sent. (7:17)
 - Moses allowed Pharaoh to choose the time the plague of frogs would be taken away "that you may know that there is no one like the LORD our God." (8:10)
 - When God sent the plague of flies He set apart Goshen where Israel lived "in order that you may know that I am the LORD in the midst of the land." (8:22)

But Pharaoh Hardened His Own Heart.

- "Pharaoh's heart grew hard, and he did not heed them, as the LORD had said... Neither was his heart moved by this." The plague of blood. (7:22)
- The plague of frogs: "when Pharaoh saw that there was relief, he hardened his heart." (8:15)
- The magicians could not make lice and recognized God, "But Pharaoh's heart grew hard, and he did not heed them." (8:19)
- When the plague of flies was removed "Pharaoh hardened his heart at this time also." (8:32)
- At plague of pestilence: "But the heart of Pharaoh became hard" (9:7).
- "When Pharaoh saw that the rain, the hail, and the thunder had ceased, he sinned yet more; and he hardened his heart, he and his servants" (9:34).
- Pharaoh continually changed the conditions of release. He bargained and lied to get out of a mess. Then he went back on the agreement, proving himself to be untrustworthy. (8:29)
- Pharaoh used the ploy, "Entreat (pray for me) the LORD...intercede for me" just to get the plagues to stop. (8:8; 8:28; 9:28; 10;17)
- Pharaoh said "I have sinned," to get the hail stopped, but Moses said "I know that you will not yet fear the LORD God." (9:27, 30)
 - And again to get rid of the plague of locusts "I have sinned"... "please forgive my sin only this once, and entreat the LORD your God, that He may take away from me this death only." (10:16)
- Pharaoh exalted himself (9:17); refused to humble himself (10:3); was stubborn (13:15).
- Pharaoh went to all lengths to preserve his power and in the process destroyed himself and the nation. (10:7)
- Pharaoh refused to listen to warnings and advice.
 - His magicians recognized that the LORD could do miracles that they could not. do "This is the finger of God." (8:19)
 - Some of his servants feared the LORD in the warning of the plague of hail and "made his servants and his livestock flee to the houses." (9:20)
 - When Moses announced the plague of locusts Pharaoh's servants said to him, "How long shall this man be a snare to us? Let the men go, that they may serve the LORD their God. Do you not yet know that Egypt is destroyed?" (10:7)

Frogs died, gathered in heaps (8:13,14).

Aaron struck dust with his rod--lice (8:17).

Nothing said about removing lice.

The LORD sent "Tomorrow" -- flies (8:23).

None in Goshen (8:22-23).

Not one fly remained (8:31).

The LORD appointed a set time "Tomorrow" -- pestilence to kill livestock (9:3-6).

None among the Israelites (9:4,7).

Moses scattered ashes toward heaven. -- boils on all Egyptians (9:8,11).

Nothing about taking away boils.

Moses stretched his rod toward heaven -- hail, thunder, fire, rain (9:22,23,33).

None where Israelites were (9:26).

As soon as Moses went out of city and spread out his hands-- ceased (9:29,33).

Moses stretched out his rod; east wind all day and night. Morning brought locusts (10:13).

A west wind blew locusts into Red Sea; not one left (10:19).

Moses stretched his hand toward heaven with no warning to Pharaoh -- thick darkness for 3 days (10:21,22).

Light where Israelites were (10:23).

The LORD struck at midnight all firstborn in Egypt (12:29; Psalm 78:49-51).

Blood on the door saved Israel (12:13,23).

God showed His power by using and controlling His own creation: water, vegetation, man, sun, animals, weather, disease, life and death, light and darkness, time, place, Pharaoh. These were the things the Egyptians worshipped. God brought judgment on all their gods (12:12). The Egyptians exchanged worship of God for worship of His creation (Romans 1:20-23).

Did God's Plan Come to Pass?

"Pharaoh's heart grew hard, and he did not heed them, as the LORD had said." (7:13)

"When Pharaoh saw that there was relief, he hardened his heart and did not heed them, as the LORD had said." (8:15)

"But Pharaoh's heart grew hard, and he did not heed them, just as the LORD had said." (8:19)

"The LORD hardened the heart of Pharaoh; and he did not heed them, just as the LORD had spoken to Moses." (9:12)

"So the heart of Pharaoh was hard; neither would he let the children of Israel go, as the LORD had spoken by Moses." (9:35)

God accomplished His purpose of convincing Israel that He is God (10:2).

A mixed multitude were also convinced and left Egypt with Israel (9:20; 12:38). "The man Moses was very great in the land of Egypt, in the sight of Pharaoh's servants and in the sight of the people." (11:3)


God accomplished His purpose that by His power His name is declared in all the earth <u>even</u> today as we read the account in the Bible. (9:16)

Each student needs a copy of this page to make the basket and the baby.




- 1. Color the baby, the basket and the basket top.

PART 8 -- A scroll with some of the laws that God gave Israel.

Each student needs: --a strip of white paper 20 inches long and 5½ inches wide;

- --two dowel sticks, or other straight sticks, 7 inches long;
- --a copy of the laws below to paste on their paper;
- --a narrow strip of cloth or ribbon to tie the scroll when finished.
- 1. Cut out the 2 strips of laws below.
- 2. Leaving 2½ inches on either end of the paper, paste the laws end #1 to end #2 on the strip of paper.
- 3. Paste one dowel stick to either end of the strip of paper. Dry thoroughly.
- 4. After pasting the strips of laws, write across the top of the long paper. Laws given to Israel by God

"If a man steals an ox or a sheep, and slaughters (#1) it or sells it, he shall restore five oxen for an ox and four sheep for a sheep. If the thief is found breaking in, and he is struck so that he dies, there shall be no guilt for his bloodshed. If the sun has risen on him, there shall be guilt for his bloodshed. He should make full restitution; if he has nothing, then he shall be sold for his theft. If the theft is certainly found alive in his hand, whether it is an ox or donkey or sheep, he shall restore double. If a man causes a field or vineyard to be grazed, and lets loose his animal, and it feeds in another man's field, he shall make restitution from the best of his own field and the best of his own vineyard. If fire breaks out and catches in thorns, so that stacked grain, standing grain, or the field is consumed, he who kindled the fire shall surely make restitution. If a man delivers to his neighbor money or articles to keep, and it is stolen out of the man's house, if the thief is found, he shall pay double. If the thief is not found, then the master of


the house shall be brought to the judges to see whether he has put his hand into his neighbor's goods. For any kind of trespass, whether it concerns an ox, a donkey, a sheep, or clothing, or for any kind of lost thing which another claims to be his, the cause of both parties shall come before the judges; and whomever the judges condemn shall pay double to his neighbor. You shall not revile God, nor curse a ruler of your people. You shall not circulate a false report. Do not put your hand with the wicked to be an unrighteous witness. You shall not follow a crowd to do evil; nor shall you testify in a dispute so as to turn aside after many to pervert justice. You shall not show partiality to a poor man in his dispute. "And you shall take no bribe, for a bribe blinds the discerning and perverts the words of the righteous. Also you shall not oppress a stranger, for you know the heart of a stranger, because you were strangers in the land of Egypt. Six years you shall sow your land and gather in its produce, but the seventh yea

you shall let it rest and lie fallow, that the poor of your people may eat; and what they leave, the beasts of the field may eat. In like manner you shall do with your vineyard and] your olive grove. Six days you shall do your work, and on the seventh day you shall rest, that your ox and your donkey may rest, and the son of your female servant and the stranger may be refreshed. And in all that I have said to you, be circumspect and make no mention of the name of other gods, nor let it be heard from your mouth. Three times you shall keep a feast to Me in the year: I will drive out the Hivite, the Canaanite, and the Hittite from before you. Little by little I will drive them out from before you, until you have increased, and you inherit the land. And I will set your bounds from the Red Sea to the sea, Philistia, and from the desert to the River. For I will deliver the inhabitants of the land into your hand, and you shall drive them out before you. You shall make no covenant with them, nor with their gods. They

shall not dwell in your land, lest they make you sin against Me. For if you serve their gods, it will surely be a snare to you." Now He said to Moses, "Come up to the Lord, you and Aaron, Nadab and Abihu, and seventy of the elders of Israel, and worship from afar. And Moses alone shall come near the Lord, but they shall not come near; nor shall the people go up with him." So Moses came and told the people all the words of the Lord and all the judgments. And all the people answered with one voice and said, "All the words which the Lord has said we will do." And Moses wrote all the words of the Lord. And he rose early in the morning, and built an altar at the foot of the mountain, and twelve pillars according to the twelve tribes of Israel. He sent young men of the children of Israel, who offered burnt offerings and sacrificed peace offerings to the Lord. He took the Book of the Covenant and read in the hearing of the people. And they said, "All that the Lord has said we will do, and be obedient."
