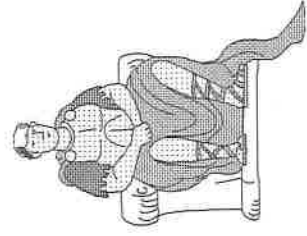

People Who Met Jesus

Purpose of This Course

- To become acquainted with people who came in contact with Jesus.
- To see how each person or group of persons reacted to Jesus.
- To try to discover why each person or group of persons reacted as they did.
- To see how people today are reacting in the same ways for the same reasons.
- For each student to examine his own reaction to Jesus.
- This series of lessons should bring home the fact that we cannot escape from reaction to Jesus and that what we do with Him, to Him, and for Him are the most important things in all of life.

Organization of This Course

There are materials for two age groups, 5-8 and 9-12 year-olds.
This course of 52 lessons is divided into 5 parts:

1. Family and Friends
2. Disciples
3. People Jesus Taught
4. People For Whom Jesus Did a Miracle
5. Leaders and People in Authority

One person or group of persons is considered in each lesson.

Each part has a review lesson.

The last lesson is a review of the entire course.

All scriptures are from the New King James Version.

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES

Bible Reading for Older Students

Bible reading as a daily habit is so important in the life of a follower of Jesus. Enclosed is a *Schedule for Reading Matthew and Luke* in which the Older student each week during the year in which this course is studied will read one chapter of Matthew and after that one of Luke. Each chapter that the student reads has a space for him/her to check it off. The schedule can be cut out and mounted on heavy paper to make it more stable and kept in the student's Bible.

Booklet:

The Things I Have Learned About Jesus Make Me --

Each Older student needs a copy of the booklet.

The booklets **must** be prepared ahead of time for use beginning with Lesson #1.

How to make the booklet:

1. Photocopy 1 copy of the 9 pages for each student.
2. Cut the pages apart on the broken lines.
3. There is a page for each lesson except the review lessons.
4. Staple all small pages together for each Part at the upper left corner with the title page for that Part on the front. Covers for Parts 2,3,4, and 5 are on page 9.

How to use the booklet:

1. Each student writes their name on the blank on the cover.
2. According to boy or girl they paste the picture found on Extra Things For Older Students
3. In each lesson he/she will fill in the blanks of the statement from the lesson that tells something that they need to remember and do because Jesus is God's Wonderful Son and He loves them. Each lesson of these Teacher's Helps has the answer key.

Name Game

Preparing the game

There are 5 pages of letters in squares, including 10 blank squares. There are no letters Q, K, V, X, F because none of these appear in the names we are using in this course.

1. Paste these pages securely and entirely to light cardboard.
2. Place the pasted pages under a pile of heavy books with wax paper between each sheet until they are thoroughly dry.
3. Cut out all the squares of letters, including the blank ones.
4. Place them in a small box or envelope for safe keeping when the game is not played.

Game Rules for Older Students

The object of the game is to review the lessons, not just to win.

1. Pile the mixed up letters in the middle of the table. Face up or face down doesn't matter.
2. The teacher gives the students a clue for a name they are to make such as one of these:
 Make any name we have studied in this Part or the Parts so far.
 Make a "5 letter" (or whatever number) name of someone we have studied.
 Make the name of one of the disciples of Jesus.
 Make the name of the person who... (give an important clue about the person).
 Some of the people's names are not given in the text, so give them a clue word that will identify that person. For example, "someone who gave his lunch," or "a person who keeps sheep," or "the kind of criminal who died with Jesus," and such like.
3. At the word "Go" the students begin picking letters from the pile in order to assemble the letters in the correct order.
4. Blank squares may be used as any letter but only one blank in a name.
5. When a student has completed the name he calls out "NAME."
6. Everyone stops.
7. The student reads the name he made.
8. The teacher checks on the spelling.
9. The student who called out then must tell something about that person, especially how that person reacted to Jesus.
10. If one or two students are finishing a name first most of the time, give them a handicap such as having to make 2 names. In this way the slower students will be able to participate.
11. You may keep score if you wish but remember winning is not the object of the game.
12. After each word, all letters are returned to the pile and the pile is stirred up.

Game Rules for the Younger Students

Follow the basic rules above with these exceptions:

On a white board, chalkboard, or large paper, print a name in large all capital letters.

Read the name aloud so the students know whose name they are making.

The students then hunt for letters to match what you have written.

When someone has completed the name, the student then tells something about that person. Taking turns others may also add other things about the person, especially how the person reacted to meeting Jesus.

After each word, all letters are returned to the pile and the pile is stirred up.

Let's Dress Up and Act Out the Story

Prepare costume pieces, long skirts, head cloths, etc. for the students to use.

Students pretend they are (*one of the people who met Jesus*) and tell how you met Jesus and how they felt about Him.

WORKSHEETS

Older students can often benefit from material on the Younger Worksheets.

Pictures on the Worksheets

Please remind the students that the pictures of Jesus and the various people who came in contact with Him are just artists' ideas of what the people looked like. The camera was not invented until many centuries later and artists of that time were not common among the Jews. In fact, most Jews believed that it was sinful to make their likeness, based on the second command of the Ten Commandments. It is important to remember that Jesus was a real man, not a feminine-looking person or a long-haired hippy. Even Isaiah 53:2 says in the famous prophecy about Him, "*He has no form or comeliness; And when we see Him, There is no beauty that we should desire Him.*" There is absolutely no indication in Scripture that He always wore white clothes or had a halo to distinguish Him from everyone else. However, we do know quite a lot about the dress and customs of that time.

Talk About--What Kind of People Met Jesus

All kinds of people met Jesus: fishermen, rulers, rich, poor, tax collectors, religious leaders, housewives, married, widows, sinners, the dead, foreigners, Jews, thieves, Gentiles, beggars, mothers, fathers, insane, outcasts, sick, soldiers, kings, a governor, teachers of the law, scribes, priests, women, men, children, a preacher, a carpenter, shepherds, wise men, demon possessed.

"Stickers" for Worksheets

In this packet there are 4 pages of "sticker" symbols to represent the reactions of the people to Jesus. Each student in both groups needs a copy of all 4 pages.

The students are to decide which sticker should be put on each worksheet. Many people will need more than one sticker. Each lesson in these Helps will give ideas of which stickers are provided to use but you may choose others.

To apply the stickers to the worksheet use paste, scotch tape, or double-sided scotch tape.

To save time the teacher should have a variety of stickers cut out ahead of time especially for Younger students and perhaps also the Older students. Some of the shapes may need to have the corners trimmed to fit on the worksheets.

Memory Verses

The Teacher's Helps suggest a Bible verse or verses (which are also on the students' worksheets) that goes with each lesson. If available, it is something that person said to or about Jesus. Otherwise it is something they did to or for Jesus. As time permits learn these verses.

There are also 2 lists of people to memorize -- *People in Jesus' Earthly Family* and *Jesus' Apostles*.

VISUAL AIDS

Posters

1. **"I Am Meeting Jesus every time I read about Him in the Bible."** Post this in an easily viewed place in the room. Refer to it often so the lessons help the students think about their own reaction to Jesus. A good time to refer to it is when they are working on their booklets.

2. **"Jesus Died..."** This poster fits well in the lessons where listed under Visual Aids.

Charts

1. **Jesus' Family** is provided to help the students understand that Jesus had half brothers and sisters whose father was Joseph. However, His Father was God by way of the Holy Spirit.

2. **The Herods** may be complicated for the students to understand but can be used to show that the Herod family was powerful and very wicked. They are important in the life of Jesus.

3. **The Apostles**, a chart for the Teacher's Information only. Too complicated for students.

Pictures

1. A series of pictures about Jesus titled **According to the Bible, What is Wrong in This**

Picture? Many pictures depicting the life of Jesus, especially His birth have things in them that are not in the Bible and some are actually contrary to what the Bible teaches. These will be used in several lessons.

2. Large pictures: a scroll; papyrus; phylacteries; fringes; the High Priest's garments; spices the Pharisees tithed; the council of the Jews; illustration of 5,000 men; inside synagogue.

Maps

Each OLDER student should have a copy of all of these maps.

1. *Where It All Happened* --In each lesson, have the students find the city or region where the person lived or where the events took place. If the name of the map is not given in the Helps, it means to use this map, *Where It All Happened*.

2. *The City of Jerusalem*--In any lesson taking place in Jerusalem, find the location.

3. *The Roman World*--In Lessons 20 and 48 find important places.

PART 1 -- FAMILY AND FRIENDS

IMPORTANT NOTE: The poster: *I Am Meeting Jesus...* should be placed in a prominent place in the classroom for this entire course. Read it aloud in every lesson to impress on the students' minds that they are deciding how they feel about Jesus as compared to the person or persons they are studying. You could also make copies of the poster so that each student would have one in their folder.

Lesson 1

Story: Mary, Jesus' mother-- Luke 1:26-38; 2:1-7.

(Matt. 12:46-50; Lu. 11:27-28; John 19:25-27; Acts 1:14.)

Application: It is important for us to do God's will no matter how difficult it may be.

Study Helps: Mary was chosen by God to be the mother of Jesus His Son -- Lu. 1:26,27,35.

God had promised that the Messiah (Christ) would come from the family of King David and that He would be a King. "throne of David" -- Isaiah 9:6-7; Lu. 1:31-33.

Mary was a godly woman like other women who accepted God's plan -- Lu. 1:30,38.

Mary was a virgin when Jesus was born -- Lu. 1:26,27.

Mary and Joseph had authority over Jesus as a child -- Lu. 2:51-52. People nowadays want to keep Jesus as a sweet little baby instead of listening to Him as a person with authority over their lives.

Mary had at least 6 other children after Jesus -- Matt. 13:55-56. These were her own children (not cousins) indicated by the fact that Jesus is called her "first-born" son -- Luke 2:7. See also Psalm 69:8.

Mary had no authority over Jesus as a man.

Jesus said spiritual relatives are more important than physical relatives --

Matt. 12:46-50; Lu. 11:27,28.

Jesus asked John to take care of Mary at His death -- John 19:25-27.

Last record of Mary (not important position in church) -- Acts 1:14.

Visual Aids:

The series of pictures about Jesus titled *According to the Bible, What is Wrong in This Picture?* Use #1-4 in this lesson. Find the false ideas that people have about what the Bible says--halos; Mary dressed like a Catholic nun; a Christmas tree with Mary, Joseph and Jesus. ("Christmas tree" is not in the Bible. First used in Germany about the year 1530 after Jesus was born.) We need to be careful to know what the Bible says and what it does not say.

Chart: *Jesus' Family.*

Map: Find Nazareth, Bethlehem.

Worksheet: Stickers -- believed in Him; rejoiced.

Younger: Paste bits of dried grass or hay on the picture of the manger. **Letters needed:** cut from a newspaper or magazine to paste where they are missing in the name: **u e**.

Older: Errors in the pictures include halos, Joseph with a shepherd's staff, a decorated Christmas tree. None are in the Bible. The *True and False*: All are false. All are inventions of the Catholic Church but other people believe many of them also.

Verse: -- "Behold the maidservant of the Lord! Let it be to me according to your word." Lu. 1:38.
Give each student a copy of *People in Jesus' Earthly Family* to take home to memorize.

Special Activities:

Older booklet: *The Things I Have Learned--* See page 1 of these Helps for instructions. Have the students read the words *The Things I Have Learned About Jesus Make Me* each time before they fill in the blanks for that lesson. **Fill in today:** *understand how important it is to follow God's way of having a Christian family.*

Younger: *Let's Dress Up and Act Out the Story:* Pretend you are Mary and tell how you met Jesus.

Older: Bible Reading-- Introduce this activity. Instructions are on page 1 of these Helps. At each lesson, check to see if the students are reading the chapters.

Lesson 2

Story: Joseph, Jesus' stepfather -- Matt. 1:18-25; Luke 2:1-7; Matt. 2:13-15,19-23; 13:55; John 6:42.

Application: It is a privilege to obey and serve God no matter what He asks.

Study Helps: Carpenter -- Matt. 13:55. (Jesus a carpenter -- Mark 6:3.)

Jews called Joseph the father of Jesus -- John 1:45; 6:42. He was Jesus' stepfather.

An angel appeared to him 3 times in dreams:

1. Announced Jesus' birth; commanded to take Mary to be his wife--Matt. 1:20.
2. Warned of danger from Herod; commanded to go to Egypt--Matt. 2:13.
3. Announced Herod's death; return to Israel--Matt. 2:19.

Warned in another dream about the new Herod; therefore went to Nazareth--Matt. 2:22,23.

Joseph's character-- just, kind (Matt. 1:19); obedient (1:24; 2:14,21).

Took care of Mary and Jesus, obeyed God; taught Jesus trade of carpentry.

Visual Aids: Chart: *Jesus' Family.*

Map: Find Nazareth, Bethlehem, Jerusalem, Egypt.

Worksheet: Stickers -- believed in Him.

Younger: Letters needed: cut from a newspaper or magazine to paste where they are missing in the name: **e u**.

Verse: "Joseph...did as the angel of the Lord commanded him and...took the young Child and His mother by night and departed for Egypt... he arose, took the young Child and His mother, and came into the land of Israel." Matt. 1:24; 2:14,21.

Check to see if anyone can repeat the names of the people in Jesus' family.

Special Activities:

Older booklet: *The Things I Have Learned--* Have the students read the words *The Things I Have Learned About Jesus Make Me* each time before they fill in the blanks for that lesson. **Fill in today:** *willing to work doing whatever good job I can do with my hands.*

Younger: Let's Dress Up and Act Out the Story: Pretend you are Joseph and tell how you met Jesus.

Older: Bible Reading-- Check to see if the students are reading.

Lesson 3

Story: The shepherds -- Luke 2:1-20.

Application: To see an angel is a frightening experience, not a sweet, pleasant thing. God does not send angels nowadays to give us His message. We have the Bible.

Study Helps:

Shepherds were afraid when angel appeared -- Lu. 2:8,9.

Other examples of fear when an angel appeared --

The Roman guards and the women at Jesus' tomb -- Matt. 28:1-5;

Zacharias in the temple -- Lu. 1:11-13;

Mary -- Lu. 1:26-30.

Galatians 1:8 -- God's warning against listening to so-called angels who bring a different message than what the Bible tells us.

Shepherds rejoiced and told what had seen; glorified God.

The word for "young Child" in Matt. 2 means "a young or little child recently born" whereas the word "Babe" here in Luke 2 means "a newborn baby."

Visual Aids: Map: Find Bethlehem.

Worksheet: Stickers -- believed in Him, told others.

Younger: Talk about who the people are in the picture as the students color it.

Verse: "Let us now go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has come to pass, which the Lord has made known to us." Luke 2:15.

Special Activities:

Older booklet: The Things I Have Learned-- Have the students read *The Things I Have Learned About Jesus Make Me* each time before they fill in the blanks for that lesson.
Fill in today: praise and sing glory to God in the Highest.

Younger: Let's Dress Up and Act Out the Story: Pretend you are the shepherds and tell how you met Jesus.

Older: Bible Reading-- Check to see if the students are reading.

Lesson 4

Story: The wise men -- Matt. 2:1-12.

Application: It should never be too far for us to go to church to worship God.

Study Helps: The word for "young Child" in here Matt. 2 means "a young or little child recently born" whereas the word "Babe" in Luke 2 means "a newborn baby."

The wise men were from the East which is probably Mesopotamia, Persia or maybe even further East. They followed a star which indicates that they were astrologers which in ancient times was a respected study of the heavens, not a superstitious religion as today.

We know there were at least two since the word is plural but the number of gifts does not necessarily mean there were three.

Visual Aids: The series of pictures about Jesus titled *According to the Bible, What is Wrong in This Picture?*. Use #5-7 in this lesson. Find the false ideas that people have about what the

Bible says--halos; exactly 3 wise men; the shepherds and wise men visited the stable at the same time; wise men wearing crowns of kings; wise men riding camels (perhaps so). We all need to be careful to know what the Bible says and what it does not say. You may want to review #1-4 also.

Map: Find Jerusalem; Bethlehem.

Worksheet: Stickers -- believed in Him; worshiped; rejoiced.

Younger: Letters needed: cut from a newspaper or magazine to paste where they are missing in the name: **a e**.

Older: In discussing the errors of the pictures, use the enlarged ones in the visual aids.

Verse: -- "Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the East and have come to worship Him." Matt. 2:2.

Special Activities:

Older booklet: *The Things I Have Learned--* Have the students read *The Things I Have Learned About Jesus Make Me* each time before they fill in the blanks for that lesson.

Fill in today: *want to worship Him.*

Younger: *Let's Dress Up and Act Out the Story:* Pretend you are the wise men and tell how you met Jesus.

Older: Bible Reading-- Check to see if the students are reading.

Lesson 5

Story: Simeon and Ana in the temple -- Luke 2:21-35; 36-38.

Application: We should be looking forward to when Jesus comes a second time.

Study Helps:

Simeon -- Knew the prophecies and delighted to live long enough to see Jesus. Showed a knowledge the O.T. prophecies in his prayer (v.29-32 i.e. Isa. 9:2; 42:6); was just and devout (v.25); was waiting for the Messiah (v.25); received revelations of the Holy Spirit (v.26,27); told about what was ahead for Jesus and Mary (v.34-35).

Ana -- a prophetess, of the tribe of Asher (v.36); elderly--84 years old (v.37); served God night and day in the temple with fastings and prayers (v.37); gave thanks to the Lord, and spoke of Him to all those who looked for redemption in Jerusalem (v.38).

Visual Aids: Map: Find Jerusalem. Picture: temple.

Worksheet: Stickers for both groups -- #1 **Simeon**- believed in Him; #2 **Ana**- believed in Him; told others.

Verse: Simeon -- "My eyes have seen Your salvation which You have prepared before the face of all peoples, a light to bring revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of Your people Israel." Luke 2:30-32

Ana -- Ana gave thanks to the Lord, and spoke of Him to all those who looked for redemption in Jerusalem. Luke 2:38

Special Activities:

Older booklet: *The Things I Have Learned --* Fill in today: *excited to see Jesus someday myself.*

Older: Bible Reading-- Check to see if the students are reading.

Lesson 6

Story: John the Baptizer--Matt. 3:1-17; 11:10-15; 14:1-12; Luke 7:18-28; John 1:15-36; 3:22-36.

Application: We should not be afraid to tell people about Jesus even when they hate us.

Study Helps: Background to the story -- Luke 1:5-25; 57-80.

Fulfilled prophecy by preparing the way for Jesus -- Matt. 3:1-3.

Explain how John was called Elijah (see Older worksheet).

Not afraid to preach about people's sins -- Matt. 3:7-12.

Baptized Jesus -- Matt. 3:13-17.

Needed assurance that Jesus was the Messiah -- Lu. 7:19-23.

Lost his life for preaching the truth -- Matt. 14:1-12.

Knew he needed to decrease in importance and make Jesus known (John 3:30).

Lesson Outline:

What kind of person was he?

Where he lived and worked.

The clothes he wore.

What kind of job he had -- fulfilled prophecy.

What did he preach?

To whom did he preach?

His message: Baptism of repentance; About Jesus.

When Jesus came how did he react?

Did he ever doubt that Jesus was the Christ?

How did he die? and why?

Visual Aids: Map: Find the Jordan River.

Worksheet: Stickers -- believed in Him; told others; doubted.

Younger: **Letters needed:** cut from a newspaper or magazine to paste where they are missing in the name: **i e.**

Verse: *"Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!"* John 1:29

Special Activities:

Older booklet: ***The Things I Have Learned--*** Fill in today: *want to obey God like He did.*

Older: **Bible Reading--** Check to see if the students are reading.

IMPORTANT NOTE: If you have not already done so, begin making the letters for the **Name Game** at this time. They need to be pasted, dried thoroughly, and cut out for use in Lesson 10. All instructions are in these Helps on page 2.

Lesson 7

Story: Jesus' brothers -- Matt. 13:55,56; John 7:1-10 (Psalm 69:8); Acts 1:14.

Application: Sometimes it is hard for people in our family to believe we are right when we believe in Jesus and follow Him. Be faithful and later see the results of others believing.

Study Helps: Matt. 13:55 gives their names -- James, Joses, Simon, Judas.

John. 2:12 -- after the wedding in Cana, went to Capernaum with Jesus.

John. 7:1-10 -- made fun of Jesus. (Jesus Himself said He would bring a sword into families because not all would believe in Him -- Matt. 10:34-37.)

Mark 3:20-21 -- said "He is out of His mind."

John 7:5 -- did not believe in Jesus (Prophesied -- Psalm 69:8.)
until after His resurrection (Acts 1:14).

Visual Aids: Chart: *Jesus' Family*. Series of pictures titled: *According to the Bible What is Wrong With This Picture* use #8 & #9 which show adult Jesus with long curly hair, halos and white clothes--standing out as different from others (Read Isaiah 53:2).

Worksheet: Stickers -- rejected Him; believed in Him.

Verse: "He is out of His mind." Mark 3:21.

Check to see if anyone can repeat the names of the people in Jesus' family.

Special Activities:

Older booklet: *The Things I Have Learned--* **Fill in today:** want to be faithful to Him even if my family does not believe in Him.

Older: Bible Reading-- Check to see if the students are reading.

Lesson 8

Story: Mary and Martha -- Lu. 10:38-42; John 11:1-45; 12:1-8.

Application: We must learn to put Jesus first. Doing our jobs is important but they should never keep us from reading the Bible and going to church.

Study Helps: Place the emphasis in this Lesson 8 on Martha and Mary. Lesson 9 will concentrate on Lazarus.

Both believed in Jesus -- John 11:27, 32; both: homemakers

Martha welcomed Jesus into her home -- Lu. 10:38.

served Jesus in her home -- Lu. 10:40-42; John 12:2.

Mary chose to listen to Him teach-- Lu. 10:39,42.

anointed Jesus -- John 12:3.

Visual Aids: Map: On Map of *The City of Jerusalem* find--Bethany.

Worksheet: Stickers for both groups -- believed in Him; obeyed Him.

Older: Teacher: Students need the Code Card for Cryptograms on Extra Things for Older Students. Before class, cut out and mount on light cardboard, one for each student. Key to this Cryptogram: **"YES, LORD, I BELIEVE YOU ARE THE CHRIST, THE SON OF GOD, WHO IS TO COME INTO THE WORLD."** Be sure to keep the code cards for future lessons.

Verse: Martha "Yes, Lord, I believe that You are the Christ, the Son of God, who is to come into the world." John 11:27.

Mary "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." John 11:32.

Special Activities:

Older booklet: *The Things I Have Learned--* **Fill in today:** put Him first and most important in my life.

Younger: **Let's Dress Up and Act Out the Story:** Pretend you are Mary or Martha and tell how you met Jesus.

Older: Bible Reading-- Check to see if the students are reading.

Lesson 9

Story: Lazarus -- John 11 and John 12:1-19.

Application: No matter what may happen to us because we follow Jesus, we must keep on believing in Him and serving Him.

Study Helps: Jesus called him "friend." -- John 11:11.

Think about what Lazarus' feelings must have been when he was raised from the dead.

He went on with regular life after his resurrection -- at a meal -- John 12:2.
 There's no record of him being proud or annoyed because people wanted to see a man that had come back from the dead. -- John 12:9.
 Many people believed in Jesus because of Lazarus' resurrection -- John 12:9-11.
 After he was raised from the dead the chief priests plotted to put him to death because on account of him many of the Jews believed in Jesus -- John 12:10,11.
 He did not run and hide when there were those who wanted to kill him.

Visual Aids: Map: On Map of *The City of Jerusalem* find--Bethany.

Worksheet: Stickers -- There is no Bible record of Lazarus' reaction to Jesus. But we can assume that he believed in Him so put the sticker "Believed in Him" on the worksheets.

Verse: There is no record of anything Lazarus said. However, his resurrection had a strong influence. John wrote: "a great many of the Jews... knew that He was there; and they came, not for Jesus' sake only, but that they might also see Lazarus, whom He had raised from the dead. But the chief priests plotted to put Lazarus to death also, because on account of him many of the Jews went away and believed in Jesus." John 12:9-11.

Special Activities:

Older booklet: *The Things I Have Learned--* Fill in today: *know He cares about me and I want to be His friend.*

Older: Bible Reading-- Check to see if the students are reading.

Lesson 10

Review Part 1.

Worksheet:

Younger: Students choose a picture and tell about the person and how they treated Jesus. Teacher can ask questions also.

Older: Match the people to either what they said or what they did in response to Jesus.

Teacher: At the end of the review lesson, staple each student's worksheets for Part 1 together with the Cover for Part 1 in front.

Memory: Check to see if anyone can repeat the names of the people in Jesus' family.

Special Activities:

Play the Name Game. See instructions on page 2 of these Helps.
 Use the people in Part 1.

Older: Bible Reading-- Check to see if the students are reading.

Older booklet: *The Things I Have Learned--* Fill in anything missing.

PART 2 -- DISCIPLES

IMPORTANT NOTE: Read the poster: *I Am Meeting Jesus...aloud* in every lesson to impress on the students' minds that they are deciding how they feel about Jesus as compared to the person or persons they are studying.

The disciples did not always understand what Jesus was telling them, but later after His resurrection they remembered:

John 2:22 -- His statement about the temple of His body.

John 12:16 --The events of the triumphal entry.

Luke 9:43-45 -- His statement that He was about to be betrayed.

Luke 18:31-34 -- His statements about His coming death and resurrection.

Lesson 11

Story: Simon Peter -- John 1:40-42; Matt. 4:18-20; 16:13-24; 17:1-8; 26:31-75 (John 18:10,11); John 21:1-19.

Application: We must learn to think of what God wants us to do before we speak or act. God knows we are all different and can use each one of us according to our personality and abilities, but we have to learn to use them properly.

Study Helps: (For the Teacher's Information, The Apostles, see chart by that name.)

Define: disciple = a learner, one who follows the teaching of another. Jesus had many disciples from which He chose 12 whom He also named apostles (Lu. 6:13).

apostle = one sent out. Jesus chose 12 for special training and work.

Peter was a fisherman from Bethsaida (John 1:44).

His name was Simon but Jesus named him Peter -- John 1:42. Sometimes called by both names--Simon Peter -- ex. Matt. 16:16; Lu. 5:8.

Peter denied knowing Jesus -- Matt. 26:58,69-74.

Peter did not always stop to think what was right before he spoke or acted--Matt. 16:21-23.

Peter made many mistakes, even denied knowing Jesus. But he repented and learned to do God's will -- Matt. 26:58,69-75.

Peter became a great leader in the kingdom of God -- (Acts and 1 & 2 Peter).

Visual Aids: Map: Find Sea of Galilee; Bethsaida.

Worksheet: Stickers -- believed in Him; obeyed Him; followed; denied; wrote about Him.

Younger: The scrolls of the books of the Bible that Peter wrote to be pasted are on Extra Things for Worksheets Younger.

Verse: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Matt. 16:16.

"I do not know the Man!" Matt. 26:72 "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You." John 21:16.

Give each student a copy of the list of *Jesus' Apostles* to take home to memorize.

Special Activities:

Older booklet: *The Things I Have Learned--* Read the title words that begin each sentence with the students each time they write in their booklets. **Fill in today:** *decide that I will think before I say something.*

Play the Name Game as time permits.

Older: Bible Reading-- Check to see if the students are reading.

Lesson 12

Story: John -- Mk. 1:19-20; 3:14-17; 10:35-45; John 18:15,16; 19:25-27; 20:1-10.

Application: Just because we follow Jesus in every way, we should never think that we should be given special favors or that we can condemn others to hell.

Study Helps:

Son of Zebedee -- Mk. 1:19-20. Although the Scripture does not say specifically, James and John must have been from Bethsaida also since they were working near Andrew and Peter when Jesus called them to be His disciples.

Mother -- Salome, Matt. 27:55,56 with Mk. 15:40.

Father had hired servants -- Mk. 1:20.

Fishermen -- With father & James in the same business as Peter & Andrew -- Mk. 1:16-19.

Called to be a disciple with James his brother -- Mk. 1:19-20.

Both on the list of apostles -- Matt. 10:2;

Jesus called John and James "Sons of Thunder" -- Mk. 3:14-17.

In Jesus' inner circle with James and Peter -- at the transfiguration Mk. 9:2.

at healing of Jarius' daughter -- Lu. 8:41,51-56.

in the garden -- Mk. 14:32-33;

at the healing Peter's mother-in-law -- Mk. 1:29-31.

With James wanted to bring down fire on village -- Lu. 9:51-56.

John and James asked for the best seats -- Mk. 10:35-45.

John was known to the high priest -- John 18:15,16.

John wrote 5 books of NT--1,2,3 John; Revelation (1:9,19); Gospel of John in which he called himself, "the disciple," "the other disciple," and "the disciple whom Jesus loved" in this book he wrote about Jesus' life -- 21:7,20,23,24 for example:

John leaned on Jesus' bosom at the last supper -- John 13:23.

John stayed nearby at Jesus' trial -- John 18:15,16.

John was given Mary to care for by Jesus on the cross --John 19:25-27.

John with Peter went to see the empty tomb -- John 20:1-10.

John was exiled on the Isle of Patmos (Rev. 1:9)

James His brother James also an apostle -- Mark 1:19-20.

In the gospels, never spoken of alone, without his brother John.

Was later beheaded by King Herod to please the Jews -- Acts 12:1,2.

Visual Aids: Map: Sea of Galilee; Bethsaida.

Worksheet: Stickers -- believed in Him; obeyed Him; followed; wrote about Him.

Younger: Letters needed: cut from a newspaper or magazine to paste where they are missing in the name: **o n**. Explain that John is one of Jesus chosen apostles and that he wrote about Jesus in the Bible. The 5 scrolls of the books of the Bible that John wrote to be pasted are on Extra Things for Worksheets Younger.

Verse: John said: *"That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked upon, and our hands have handled, concerning the Word of life [Jesus]...we have seen, and bear witness, and declare to you that eternal life."* 1 John 1:1,2.

Check if anyone can repeat the names of Jesus' Apostles.

Special Activities:

Older booklet: The Things I Have Learned-- Read the title words that begin each sentence. **Fill in today:** believe in Jesus because of the things John wrote about Him.

Play the **Name Game** as time permits.

Older: Bible Reading-- Check to see if the students are reading.

Lesson 13

Story: Andrew -- John 1:35-42; Matt. 4:18-20; Lu. 6:14; John 6:8-9.

Application: It is important to follow Jesus ourselves but just as important to bring others to follow Him too.

Study Helps: Peter's brother --Matt. 4:18-20; Lu. 6:14; John 6:8;

Fisherman -- Matt. 4:18.

Was one of the two who heard John baptizer call Jesus Lamb of God -- John 1:35-36,40.

List of apostles -- Luke 6:14

Was from the city of Bethsaida as was Philip, Peter and Andrew -- John 1:44

Worked with Philip -- John 6:7,8; 12:22.

Brought people to Jesus --

Peter John 1:35-42;

boy with lunch -- John 6:8,9. *this story is used in detail in Lessons 29 and 37.*

Greeks -- John 12:20-22.

Called by Jesus - Matt. 4:18-20; chosen apostle - Lu. 6:13-14.

With Peter, James and John asking important questions -- Mk. 13:3

Visual Aids: Map: Find Bethsaida, Sea of Galilee.

Worksheet: Stickers -- believed in Him; told others; followed.

Verse: "*We have found the Messiah*" (which is translated, the Christ). John 1:41.

Special Activities:

Older booklet: The Things I Have Learned-- Fill in today: want to tell others about Him.

Play the Name Game as time permits and from now on throughout the course.

Older: Bible Reading-- Check to see if the students are reading.

Lesson 14

Story: Philip -- John 1:43-46; John 6:5-7; John 12:20-23; 14:8-9.

Application: Sharing the work we do for Jesus is good.

Study Helps: Jesus chose Philip to be an apostle -- John 1:43; Matt. 10:2-3.

Jesus questioned Philip and Philip asked Jesus a question -- John 6:5-7; John 14:8,9.

Brought Nathanael to Jesus -- John 1:43-46.

Worked with Andrew to bring Greeks to Jesus -- John 12:20-23.

From Bethsaida, same town as Andrew and Peter -- John 1:44.

Visual Aids: Map: Find Bethsaida.

Worksheet: Stickers -- believed in Him; told others; followed.

Younger: Sign "Sea of Galilee" to paste are on Extra Things for Worksheets Younger.

Verse: "*We have found Him of whom Moses in the law, and also the prophets, wrote--Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph.*" John 1:45.

Special Activities:

Older booklet: The Things I Have Learned-- Fill in today: want to work with others doing good things for Him.

Older: Bible Reading-- Check to see if the students are reading.

Lesson 15

Story: Matthew (Levi) -- Matt. 9:9-13; Lu. 5:27-32; Mk. 2:14-17; Matt 10:3.

Application: Following Jesus is more important than a job. Be sure your job is the kind that God approves of.

Study Helps: Combine the three accounts to capture the details that each tells.

Jesus called Matthew to be an apostle -- Matthew 9:9; 10:2-3.

Known as Levi the son of Alphaeus also -- Lu. 5:27; Mk. 2:14.

In Capernaum (Mk. 2:1), sitting by the Sea (Mk. 2:13,14).

"Left all"-- his job as a tax collector to follow Jesus -- Lu. 5:28.

Tax collectors were hated by the Jews because they were Jews who collected taxes for the ruling Romans (Gentiles) and were generally extortionists. Matt. 9:11.
 Invited friends to a banquet to meet Jesus -- Lu. 5:29-32.
 Pharisees complained -- (see also Lu. 18:9-14).
 Matthew (Levi) wrote the Gospel According to Matthew.

Visual Aids: Map: Find Capernaum, Sea of Galilee.

Worksheet: Stickers -- believed in Him; followed; wrote about Him; told others.

Younger: Money pictures to paste are on Extra Things for Worksheets Younger.

Older: Answers to "The Gospel According to Matthew"-- 1. *Matthew*; 2. *quotes*; 3. *the Holy Spirit*; 4. *He was with Jesus*; 5. *birth, miracles, enemies, apostles, teaching, death and resurrection*.

Verse: *Jesus said to Matthew-Levi, "Follow Me." So he left all, rose up, and followed Him.*
 Luke 5:27,28. Check if anyone can repeat the names of Jesus' Apostles.

Special Activities:

Older booklet: The Things I Have Learned-- Fill in today: *remember to be careful of the kind of job I take when I grow up.*

Older: Bible Reading-- Check to see if the students are reading.

Lesson 16

Story: Judas Iscariot -- Lu. 6:13-16; John 12:3-6; Matt. 26:14-16, 21-25, 47-50 (see Mk. 14:44);
 Matt. 27:1-5; Acts 1:15-20.

Application: We must watch closely that we do not betray Jesus by loving money so much that we will do anything to get more. We must always love and be loyal to Jesus.

Study Helps:

One of the 12 apostles chosen by Jesus -- Lu. 6:13-16.

Treasurer for Jesus and disciples -- John 13:29 "held the money box."

A thief -- John 12:6. 300 denarii = wages for a worker for 1 year.

Loved money more than Jesus -- Matt. 26:14-16.

Jesus knew his plan and called him "son of perdition (destruction) and "a devil" because he would betray Jesus -- John 17:12; John 6:70; Lu. 6:16.

traitor = one who is a false friend; betrays the trust another has in him; a deceiver.

Betrayed Jesus for money -- Matt. 26:14-16,21-25,47-50.

Brought men to garden and signaled who Jesus was with a kiss -- Matt. 26:48,49.

Told the soldiers "Whomever I kiss, He is the One; seize Him and lead Him away safely."

Mk. 14:44. Talk about possibly the reason why.

Was "remorseful" over Jesus being condemned -- Matt. 27:3.

Remorseful = to feel hopelessly guilty.

Committed suicide instead of repenting -- Matt 27:3-5; Acts 1:15-20.

See the article: *Who Crucified Jesus?* in the Helps.

Love of money is sin -- 1 Tim. 6:6-10.

Visual Aids: Maps: On Map *Where It All Happened* find--Bethany.

On Map of *The City of Jerusalem* find--Gethsemane, temple.

Worksheet: Stickers -- believed in Him ;followed; betrayed.

Verse: *"Why was this fragrant oil not sold for three hundred denarii and given to the poor?"*
 John 12:5. *"What are you willing to give me if I deliver Him to you?"* Matt. 26:15.

Special Activities:

Older booklet: The Things I Have Learned-- Fill in today: to not love money or the things money can buy.

Older: Bible Reading-- Check to see if the students are reading.

Lesson 17

Story: Nathanael -- John 1:45-51.

Application: We should not believe everything people say about God before we check in the Bible to see if those things are true.

Study Helps: Nathanael and Bartholomew are thought to be the same person. Perhaps had surname of Bartholomew.

Brought to Jesus by Philip -- John 1:45-51.

Doubted what Philip said but went to check it out.

Believed Jesus was the Son of God, the King of Israel, because Jesus told him what he was doing before Philip went to him. Had to have known the prophecies to make such a statement.

From Cana -- among disciples fishing after resurrection -- John 21:2.

Visual Aids: Map: Find Cana, Sea of Galilee.

Worksheet: Stickers -- believed in Him; followed.

Younger: Pictures to paste in *What Does God Know About Me* are found on Extra Things for Worksheets Younger. **Letters needed:** cut from a newspaper or magazine to paste where they are missing in the name: o o.

Verse: "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" John 1:46.

"Rabbi, You are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!" John 1:49

Special Activities:

Older booklet: The Things I Have Learned-- Fill in today: find out if what I hear people say about God and Jesus is true.

Older: Bible Reading-- Check to see if the students are reading.

Lesson 18

Story: Thomas -- Matt. 10:2-4; John 11:16; 14:1-7; 20:19-29.

Application: We believe because of the written inspired testimony of the disciples who were there and saw all the things Jesus did and said.

Study Helps: Called "the Twin" -- John 11:16; 20:24; 21:2.

Was willing to die with Jesus -- John 11:16.

Doubted what he was told about Jesus' resurrection -- 20:24-29;

Believed when Jesus showed him his hands and side -- 20:24-29;

Jesus said "Thomas, because you have seen Me, you have believed.

Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." -- 20:29

Among disciples fishing after resurrection -- John 21:2.

The Slowness of EVERYONE to Believe That Jesus Had Risen From the Dead

Even though Jesus had predicted His resurrection many times, the people did not understand what He was talking about.

The women went to the tomb to add spices to a dead body -- Lu. 21:1.
 Mary Magdalene only thought someone had stolen the body -- John 20:13,15.
 The disciples thought the women's report of His resurrection was "idle tales" --Lu. 24:11.
 When the 2 from Emmaus told the disciples they had seen Jesus, "neither did they believe them" -- Mk. 16:12,13.
 Jesus appeared to the 10 but they thought He was a ghost until He told them to look at His hands, side and feet and to handle Him. He asked for food and ate. -- Lu. 24:36-47.
 After that, a week later Thomas felt there was some mistake and demanded proof which Jesus gave him -- John 20:24-29.
 It's not wrong to want proof. The other apostles also needed proof to believe -
 Lu. 24:21-27,36-46; Mk. 16:11,13-14.

Visual Aids: Poster: *Jesus Died.* Map: On Map *The City of Jerusalem* find--the upper room.

Worksheet: Stickers -- believed in Him; doubted; followed.

Younger: **Letters needed:** cut from a newspaper or magazine to paste where they are missing in the name: **e u l e a o e.**

Older: Need the Code Card for Cryptograms. Key to this Cryptogram: **"MY LORD AND MY GOD!"**

Verse: *"My Lord and my God!"* John 20:28.

Special Activities:

Older booklet: *The Things I Have Learned--* **Fill in today:** check to see what the Bible says when people tell me something about Jesus.

Older: **Bible Reading--** Check to see if the students are reading.

Lesson 19

Story: The women -- Lu. 8:1-3; 23:46-49, 55-56; 24:1-12.

Application: We should give what we have to help others who go preaching the gospel.

Study Helps: The Scriptures do not always list the same women but frequently add "and others" so in this lesson we have tried to include as many names as possible on the worksheets.

Lu. 8:1-3 -- Jesus went through every city and village, preaching and bringing the glad tidings of the kingdom of God. And the twelve were with Him, and certain women who had been healed of evil spirits and infirmities-- who provided for Him from their substance.

Mary called Magdalene, (Lesson 33 is about her alone),

Joanna the wife of Chuza, Herod's steward,

Susanna,

and many others

Lu. 23:55--24:11 -- came with Him from Galilee (23:49); at the cross (23:49); saw the tomb (23:55); brought spices to anoint the body (24:1); found stone rolled away (24:2); first to learn of resurrection (24:3-8); and told apostles what saw (24:9).

Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary, mother of James, (Mk. 15:47--Mary the mother of James the Less and of Joses) and others Salome (with Mk. 15:40;16:1 and

Matt. 27:55,56 is considered to be mother of Zebedee's sons)

Other Scriptures that talk about these women-- Mk. 15:40-47;16:1-7.

Visual Aids: Map: Find the region of Galilee, Jerusalem.

Worksheet: Stickers -- believed in Him; obeyed Him; followed; shared.

Younger: Word "Bible" to paste is on Extra Things for Worksheets, Younger.

Older: Key to Unscramble--giving, healed, believed, women, Jesus.

Verse: Certain women who had been healed of evil spirits and infirmities...provided for Him from their substance. Luke 8:2,3. (substance=possessions)

Special Activities:

Older booklet: The Things I Have Learned-- Fill in today: *want to give money to help others who are preaching the good news about Him.*

Older: Bible Reading-- Check to see if the students are reading.

Lesson 20

Story: Saul called Paul -- Acts 7:54 to 8:3; 9:1-22.

Application: When we find out we were wrong in what we were doing, we should be willing to humble ourselves and turn to doing what is right like Jesus wants us to.

Study Helps: Paul also tells of his conversion in Acts 22 and 26.

Born in Tarsus -- Acts 21:39.

A Pharisee -- Philippians 3:5; Acts 23:6.

Did not meet Jesus until after He had gone back to heaven.

Turned from persecuting Christians to preaching the gospel and being persecuted himself.

Wrote most of the books of the New Testament.

Visual Aids: Maps: On the Map of *The Roman World* find--Tarsus, Damascus, Jerusalem, and some of the cities where he preached.

Worksheet: Stickers -- rejected Him; angry; believed in Him; told others; obeyed Him; followed; worshiped; wrote about Him.

Older: Need the Code Card for Cryptograms. Key to this Cryptogram: **"LORD, WHAT DO YOU WANT ME TO DO?"**

Verse: "Lord, what do You want me to do?" Acts 9:6.

Special Activities:

Older booklet: The Things I Have Learned-- Fill in today: *willing to change what I am doing when I find out that I am wrong.*

Older: Bible Reading-- Check to see if the students are reading.

Lesson 21

Review Part 2.

Worksheet:

Younger: Students choose a picture and tell about the person and how they treated Jesus. Teacher can ask questions also.

PART 3 -- PEOPLE JESUS TAUGHT

IMPORTANT NOTE: Read the poster: *I Am Meeting Jesus...* aloud in every lesson to impress on the students' minds that they are deciding how they feel about Jesus as compared to the person or persons they are studying.

Lesson 22

Story: Teachers in the Temple -- #1--Luke 2:41-52; #2--John 2:13-16.

Application: We need to learn all we can about God, Jesus, and the Bible so we can ask good questions and give good answers.

Study Helps: The Scripture texts have a contrast between both Jesus' actions and the reactions of the teachers in the temple when Jesus was a 12 year-old boy, and when He was a grown man with the Jews in the temple.

The child Jesus amazed them with His understanding and knowledge of the Scriptures. But later when Jesus condemned their misuse of the temple and quoted the Scriptures, they hated Him. "And the scribes and chief priests heard it and sought how they might destroy Him." Mk. 11:18. Why were their reactions so different?

People nowadays are like that also. The baby Jesus is cute and non-threatening and they love to celebrate His birth. But many of the same people don't want to know very much about the Man Jesus because He taught some hard things that mean they would have to change their lives if they did what He taught.

Apparently Jesus cleansed the temple twice, once early in His ministry (John 2:13-16) and again shortly before He was crucified (Matt. 21:12-16; Mark 11:15-18; Luke 19:45-46). In this lesson, the two cleansing incidents are combined to bring out the contrast with His childhood visit in the temple.

Jesus spoke of "my Father's business," and "My Father's house." He knew that Joseph was only His stepfather.

Visual Aids: Maps: On Map *Where...Happened* find--Nazareth, Jerusalem.
On Map *The City of Jerusalem* find--the temple.

Worksheet: **Stickers for both groups** -- #1 questioned Him; astonished; #2 questioned Him.

Older: After pasting the stickers, the students draw an arrow to the picture that goes with each sticker.

Verse: #1 "Jesus was in the temple...with...the teachers, both listening to them and asking them questions. And all who heard Him were astonished at His understanding and answers." Luke 2:46,47.

#2 Jesus taught, saying to them, "Is it not written, 'My house shall be called a house of prayer for all nations'? But you have made it a 'den of thieves.'" And the scribes and chief priests heard it and sought how they might destroy Him. Mk. 11:17,18.

Special Activities:

Older booklet: The Things I Have Learned-- Read the title words that begin each sentence with the students each time they write in their booklets. **Fill in today:** *want to learn all I can about God, Jesus, and the Bible so I can ask good questions and give correct answers.*

Older: Bible Reading-- Check each Lesson to see if the students are reading.

Lesson 23

Story: The Nazarenes -- Luke 4:16-30; Matt. 13:54-58; Mk. 6:1-6.

Application: Even when you disagree with someone it is no excuse to try to hurt them.

Study Helps:

The Nazarenes were blinded to who Jesus was--did not believe He was the Son of God, but just a human being and were offended --Mk. 6:1-6; Matt. 13:57; were filled with wrath and tried to murder Him for His teaching--Lu. 4:28,29.

What is a synagogue?

A synagogue is the Jewish building used for reading, explaining, and teaching the Old Testament Scriptures. There was at least one in each town; in larger cities there were many. The idea for synagogues is thought to have begun during the Babylonian captivity. Many references are made to them in the New Testament. Some examples: Jesus taught in the synagogue (Matthew 4:23; Mark 1:21; 6:2; Luke 4:15-30; 13:10; John 6:59; 18:20). Paul went to synagogues wherever he traveled to teach the Jews about Jesus (Acts 13:2-5; 17:1-3; 19:8). Even today, the Jews have synagogues in many places throughout the world where they live.

What did a synagogue look like?

It was a building made of stone. The size and type of construction depended on the size and wealth of the congregation. The basic furniture was:

a chest--the cabinet in which the scrolls of the Old Testament were kept;

a platform and pulpit--the elevated place where the scriptures were read
(reader standing: Luke 4:16) and explained (man sitting: Luke 4:20,21);

benches--the teachers, rulers of the synagogue and important people sat in front. The rest of the people sat behind these, with the men on one side and the women on the other.

Visual Aids: Pictures in the packet: Inside of a synagogue; A group in a synagogue; A crowd in a synagogue; A synagogue pulpit. Map: Find Nazareth.

Worksheet: Stickers -- angry; rejected Him.

Older: in *Find the prophecy* the key is in Lu. 4:17. The answer is Isaiah 61:1,2.

Verse: *"Where did this Man get this wisdom and these mighty works? Is this not the carpenter's son? Is not His mother called Mary? And His brothers James, Joses, Simon, and Judas? And His sisters, are they not all with us? Where then did this Man get all these things?"*
Matt. 13:54-56

Special Activities:

Older booklet: *The Things I Have Learned--* **Fill in today:** *remember that even when I disagree with someone it is no excuse to try to hurt them .*

Lesson 24

Story: The multitudes -- Matt. 4:23 to 8:1 and others.

Application: Don't do things just because everyone else is doing it. Think for yourself and ask yourself, "What is the truth? What is right? What would God want me to do?"

Study Helps: The Scripture text looks very long but do not try to use all of the sermon on the mount in the Scripture text. But pick out some that the children can understand. The emphasis is on the reaction of the multitude to the things Jesus taught which were different from what their religious leaders taught them. At other times they were amazed when Jesus healed people. Do not try to cover all the stories but use the material in the crossword puzzle on the Older worksheet as a means of showing their reactions.

The Multitudes had mixed reasons for following Jesus:

Waiting and welcomed -- Lu. 8:40.

Came to hear -- Lu. 5:1,15; 6:17; 21:38.

Came to be healed -- Lu. 5:15.

Wanted to make Jesus an earthly king for personal advantage--John 6:15,26; (Lu. 24:21)

Their mixed reactions to Jesus' miracles and teachings:

Called Jesus, a prophet -- Matt. 14:5; 21:11; Lu. 7:16; 24:19; John 4:19; 6:14; 7:40; 9:17.

Astonished at His teaching -- Matt. 7:28; 22:33; Mk. 1:22; 11:18; Lu. 4:32;

by His miracles -- Mk. 7:37. Astonish = to feel wonder and surprise.

Marveled at His miracles -- Matt. 9:8,33; 15:31; Lu. 9:43; 11:14; John 7:21;

at His teaching -- Matt. 22:22. Marvel = to be excited with wonder and surprise.

Rejoiced for all the glorious things done by Him -- Lu. 13:17.

Amazed -- Lu. 5:26; Matt. 12:22; Mk. 1:27. Amazed = to feel overcome with wonder.

Filled with fear -- Lu. 5:26; 7:16; 8:37.

Praised God for His mighty works -- Lu. 18:43; 19:31.

Glorified God for His miracles-- Matt. 9:8; 15:31; Mk. 2:12; Lu. 5:26; for teaching Lu. 4:15.

Glorified = gave great praise to God; worshipped.

Maimed = not able to use a part of body; paralyzed;; crippled; disabled; disfigured.

Mute = unable to speak; dumb (*does not mean stupid*).

Some left because some teaching too hard -- John 6:60-66.

Crowds are fickle.

They saw Jesus' miracles and believed. Many followed Him for what they could benefit themselves physically. They glorified Him at the triumphal entry into Jerusalem and yelled "Crucify him! Crucify him!" to Pilate a few days later. Rejected = to throw away as worthless.

In these Helps see article: *Who Crucified Jesus?*

Worksheet: Stickers -- believed in Him; astonished; followed; rejoiced; rejected Him.

Younger: Answers to pasting stickers: *"Truly this is the Prophet."* John 7:40. *"This is the Christ."* John 7:41. Believed in Him. All the multitude rejoiced for all the glorious things that were done by Him. Lu. 13:17. Rejoiced. When Jesus had ended these sayings, that the people were astonished at His teaching. Matt. 7:28. Astonished. *"Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the kingdom of our father David That comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!"* Mark 11:9,10. Followed. *"Crucify Him!"* Mark 15:13. Rejected.

Older: The Key to the clues and completed puzzle are on page 40 of these Helps. Especially in this lesson, the older students would benefit from the Younger worksheet also.

Verse: *"Truly this is the Prophet."* John 7:40. *"This is the Christ."* John 7:41. *"We have seen strange things today!"* Lu. 5:26. *"Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the kingdom of our father David that comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!"* Mark 11:9,10. *"Crucify Him!"* Mark 15:13.

Special Activities:

Older booklet: The Things I Have Learned-- Fill in today: careful to not follow the crowd but choose to believe and do what is right.

Lesson 25

Story: Samaritan woman -- John 4:1-43.

Application: We should not just tell others about Jesus but we must open the Bible so that God's words will cause them to believe.

Study Helps: Housewife, multiple marriages, fornicator; excited; told others who believed also because of Jesus' own words.

A Samaritan was a descendant of foreign people that Assyria brought in to populate the northern kingdom of Israel after carrying the Israelites away into captivity (2 Kings 17:6,24-33). They knew somewhat about the Law of God, having been taught by a priest sent from captivity to them. 2 Kings 17:33 says: "They feared the Lord, yet served their own gods--according to the rituals of the nations from among whom they were carried away." They were never accepted by the Jews; were hated and considered unclean people with whom they wanted nothing to do.

Jesus' actions at the well showed that He considered the Samaritans worthy of being taught the truth about God.

Visual Aids: Map: Find region of Samaria, the city of Sychar.

Worksheet: Stickers -- believed in Him; rejoiced; told others.

Older: Answers to *What is a Samaritan--* and Babylon, and Judah, and a prophet, almost.

Verse: *"Come, see a Man who told me all things that I ever did. Could this be the Christ?"*
John 4:29

Special Activities:

Older booklet: *The Things I Have Learned--* Fill in today: read to others from the Bible so that God's words will cause them to believe.

Lesson 26

Story: Zacchaeus -- Luke 19:1-10.

Application: If we have cheated someone or done something wrong to another, we should do whatever we can to make it right.

Study Helps: Tax collector (also called a publican) -- a Jew who worked for the Roman government to collect taxes from the Jewish people. They were hated by the Jews for working for the hated Roman government that occupied their land. The tax collectors were known for extortion (taking more money than legal) from the people.

Zacchaeus was eager to see Jesus, climbed a tree -- Lu. 19:3,4.

welcomed Jesus into his home joyfully -- Lu. 19:6.

decided to make right what he had done wrong -- Lu. 19:8-10.

Visual Aids: Map: Find Jericho.

Worksheet: Stickers -- believed in Him; rejoiced.

Verse: *"Look, Lord, I give half of my goods to the poor; and if I have taken anything from anyone by false accusation, I restore fourfold."* Luke 19:8

Special Activities:

Older booklet: *The Things I Have Learned--* Fill in today: know that if I have done something wrong to another person, I should do whatever I can to make it right.

Lesson 27

Story: Rich young ruler -- Matt. 19:16-26; Mk. 10:17-27; Luke 18:18-27.

Application: My things and money should never be more important than obeying God.

Study Helps: Wanted salvation but went away sorrowful, rather choosing riches--Matt. 19:16,22.

He was young -- Matt. 19:20.

He was a ruler -- Lu. 18:18.

He came running to Jesus and knelt down -- Mk. 10:17.

Scriptures about giving to poor -- Prov. 19:17; Matt. 25:37-40; Phil. 4:14-17.

Define: distribute = to give out. (Lu. 18:22)

Worksheet: Stickers -- questioned Him; disappointed; rejected Him.

Younger: The pictures to paste are on Extra Things for Worksheets Younger.

Verse: "Good Teacher, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?" Lu. 18:18

Special Activities:

Older booklet: The Things I Have Learned-- Fill in today: understand that my things and money should never be more important than obeying God.

Lesson 28

Story: Simon the Pharisee -- Luke 7:36-50.

Application: The way we treat visitors is the same as if we were treating Jesus that way.

Study Helps: Pharisee (v. 36); ill-mannered (v. 44-46); critical (v.39).

Pharisees considered themselves to be holier than others because they kept strictly God's law with many strict rules that they thought the Law meant. The Pharisees will be studied in detail in Lesson 44.

Anoint = to put oil on.

Worksheet: Stickers -- mocked.

Verse: "This man, if He were a prophet, would know who and what manner of woman this is who is touching Him, for she is a sinner." Luke 7:39

Special Activities:

Older booklet: The Things I Have Learned-- Fill in today: know that how I treat others who visit me is the same as if I were treating Jesus that way.

Lesson 29

Story: The 5,000 who were fed -- John 6:5-66 with Matt. 14:21.

Application: To go to church to get prizes (or clothes or food) are not the right reasons.

Study Helps: Emphasis on the 5,000 plus people. The boy with a lunch is Lesson 37. You can remind the students that this is the time that Philip (Lesson 14) and Andrew (Lesson 13), whom you have already studied, were involved in finding food for the multitude.

Called Jesus the Prophet -- see Deut. 18:18,19.

They wanted to make Jesus king (v. 15)

--who would restore Israel again because they had a misunderstanding of the kingdom that the Messiah would bring, thinking it would be one on earth;

--for personal gain -- a king who could miraculously provide food for them;

Some disciples left because His spiritual teaching was too hard --(v. 66).

Visual Aids: Poster of 5,000 men. Map: Sea of Galilee, Capernaum (John 6:17,24).

Worksheet: Stickers -- believed in Him; questioned Him; rejected him.

Older: Need code card. Key to this Cryptogram: **THIS IS TRULY THE PROPHET WHO IS TO COME INTO THE WORLD.**

Verse: "This is truly the Prophet who is to come into the world." John 6:14.

Special Activities:

Older booklet: The Things I Have Learned-- Fill in today: know that the right reasons for which I should go to church are to worship God and learn about Him, not to get prizes or clothes or food.

Lesson 30

Story: The 2 criminals on the crosses -- Luke 23:32,33, 39-43.

Application: When we are suffering we should not blame God.

Study Helps: Both criminals were robbers -- Matt. 27:44. one believed; the other mocked.

Visual Aids: Poster: Jesus Died. Map of The City of Jerusalem find--Calvary.

Worksheet: Stickers for both groups -- #1 rejected Him; #2 believed in Him.

Younger: Letters needed: cut from a newspaper or magazine to paste where they are missing in the name: **e u l e**.

Verse: One of the criminals (*robbers*) who were hanged blasphemed Him, saying, "If You are the Christ, save Yourself and us." Lu. 23:39.

But **the other**, "This Man has done nothing wrong." Then he said to Jesus, "Lord, remember me when You come into Your kingdom." Lu. 23:41,42

Special Activities:

Older booklet: The Things I Have Learned-- Fill in today: know that He died to save me from my sins if I obey Him.

Lesson 31

Story: The 2 men on the road to Emmaus -- Luke 24:13-36.

Application: We should be excited that Jesus arose from the dead and hurry to tell others.

Study Helps:

Called Jesus the Prophet--v.19 (see Deut. 18:18,19).

Hoping He would redeem Israel from the Romans with an earthly kingdom -- v. 21.

Considered that Jesus had failed but Jesus used the prophecies of the Old Testament to prove that He had not failed--v. 21,25-27.

Excited when discovered that Jesus had risen from the dead--v. 33.

Hurried to share the news with the apostles--v. 33-35.

Visual Aids: Poster: Jesus Died. Map: Find Jerusalem, Emmaus.

Worksheet: Stickers -- disappointed; believed in Him; told others.

Younger: Letters needed: cut from a newspaper or magazine to paste where they are missing in the name: **e u l e a o e**.

Older: Key to the prophecy and fulfillment exercise is at the end of these Helps, page 41.

Verse: "Jesus of Nazareth, who was a Prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people...our rulers...have crucified Him. But we were hoping that it was He who was going to redeem Israel." Luke 24:19-21

Special Activities:

Older booklet: The Things I Have Learned-- Fill in today: excited that Jesus arose from the dead and hurry to tell others about it.

Lesson 32

Review Part 3.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Read the poster: *I Am Meeting Jesus...* aloud in every lesson to impress on the students' minds that they are deciding how they feel about Jesus as compared to the person or persons they are studying.

Jesus had compassion on those who suffered physically.

Although He does not do miracles today, we can recognize that He provides doctors and medicines that give us relief and extend our lives.

His miracles proved that what He taught was the truth from God.

Lesson 33

Story: Mary Magdalene -- Lu. 8:2-3; John 19:25; 20:1-18.

Application: We should thank God when we get well from an illness. Most of all we should thank Him for sending Jesus to take away our sins.

Study Helps: Healed of 7 demons -- Lu. 8:2. Showed her gratitude for being healed of such a terrible thing with other women (Lesson 19) by providing for Jesus' needs with their substance (their possessions, money) -- Lu. 8:2-3.

Demons--Lesson 36 has more information.

Explain: **Rabboni** -- My great Master. John 20:16 says, "which is to say Teacher."

Rabbi -- Master, a term of respect for a teacher.

Lord -- He who has great power and authority; master; owner.

Worksheet: Stickers -- believed in Him; followed.

Verse: Mary Magdalene said: "My Lord" John 20:13; "Rabboni!" John 20:16

Special Activities:

Older booklet: *The Things I Have Learned--* Read the title words that begin each sentence with the students each time they write in their booklets. **Fill in today:** *remember to thank God when I get well from an illness.*

Lesson 34

Story: Three men who asked for healing for someone else:

#1 Nobleman for his son -- John 4:46-53.

#2 Jairus for his daughter -- Mark 5:22-24, 35-43.

#3 Centurion for a sick servant -- Matt. 8:5-13.

Application: We should ask God, according to His will, to help sick people to get well.

Study Helps:

Nobleman -- a royal official, persisted in begging Jesus to help him even when Jesus accused him of just wanting to see miracles; believed and his whole household.

Jairus -- a synagogue ruler (Story also told in Luke 8:41-42, 49-56.) Even though he had asked Jesus to raise her, he was astonished when Jesus did it (Matt. 9:18).

Centurion -- a Roman soldier (Gentile) of such faith and feeling of unworthiness who recognized Jesus' power and authority. (Story also told in Luke 7:1-10.)

Visual Aids: Map: Find #1--Galilee, Cana, Capernaum. #2--Capernaum. #3--Capernaum.

Worksheet: Stickers #1-believed in Him. #2-believed in Him; worshiped Him. #3-believed in Him.

Verse: #1--The **Nobleman** said: "Sir, come down before my child dies!" John 4:49
 #2--**Jairus** said: "My little daughter lies at the point of death. Come and lay Your hands on her, that she may be healed, and she will live." Mark 5:23.
 #3--The **Centurion** said: "Lord, I am not worthy that You should come under my roof. But only speak a word, and my servant will be healed." Matt. 8:8

Special Activities:

Older booklet: *The Things I Have Learned--* Fill in today: ask God, according to His will, to help others get well when they are sick.

Lesson 35

Story: The ten lepers -- Luke 17:11-19.

Application: Jesus wants us to be thankful to others for what they do for us.

Study Helps: What is leprosy? Leprosy is a disease that begins as spots on the skin. Later the spots become lumps which open up into painful sores. The sores gradually cause loss of skin and flesh, with deformity, loss of feeling, paralysis, serious infections, and sometimes blindness. Lepers were outcasts. People with leprosy had to live away from other people and call out "Unclean!" Today there are medicines to treat leprosy but it is still a terrible disease to have.

Only one Samaritan (out of the ten men), whom Jesus called a foreigner (v.18), came back to thank Jesus. See Lesson 25 for more information about Samaritans. The Jews hated the Samaritans, yet the other 9 lepers (Jews) did not return to thank Jesus. Jesus loved the Samaritans and another time in teaching a Jewish lawyer told the story we call "The Good Samaritan (Lu. 10:25-37).

Visual Aids: Map: Find region of Samaria.

Worksheet: Stickers for both groups--All--believed in Him; One--worshiped; and thanked Him.

Verse: *Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!*" Luke 17:13

Special Activities:

Older booklet: *The Things I Have Learned--* Fill in today: be thankful to others for what they do for me.

Older: Bible Reading-- Check to see how much the students are reading.

Lesson 36

Story: Legion -- Mark 5:1-20.

Application: We should be so happy about what Jesus has done for us that we go tell others about Him.

Study Helps:

Explain "demons" -- The words "demons" and "unclean spirits" are used interchangeably (verses 2,8,12,13,15). Servants of Satan ("Beelzebub, the ruler of the demons"--Matt. 12:24-27). Beelzebub is a name used for Satan as Jesus so identified. **BE SURE** to explain that just because a person is deaf, mute, blind, or epileptic, does NOT mean that they are demon-possessed. Demons in Jesus' day used those methods to control the person. It seems that Satan, the prince of demons, was doing all he could to try to defeat Jesus when He was on earth.

Possessed = to be controlled by something.

Epileptic = a disease of the nervous system which causes times of unconsciousness or seizures.

People of that town asked Jesus to leave--more concerned over their property loss than the miracle Jesus had done.

Decapolis means 10 cities. A region originally given to the Jewish tribe of Manasseh but much later in history was settled by Greeks (Gentiles).

Visual Aids: Map: Find Sea of Galilee, Decapolis and area of Gadarenes.

Worksheet: Stickers -- worshiped; obeyed; told others.

Younger: Letters needed: cut from a newspaper or magazine to paste where they are missing in the name: **a.** Explain that Mark is one of the men who wrote about Jesus in the Bible.

Verse: "My name is Legion; for we are many." Mark 5:9. He began to proclaim in Decapolis all that Jesus had done for him; and all marveled. Mark 5:18-20.

Special Activities:

Older booklet: The Things I Have Learned-- Fill in today: happy about what Jesus has done for me.

Lesson 37

Story: The boy with a lunch -- John 6:1-13 with Matt. 14:21.

Application: We should share what we have with others.

Study Helps: This story was used in Lesson 29 about the reaction of the 5,000 who were fed. It is also in Matt. 14:13-21; Lu. 9:11-17; and Mk. 6:32-44. John 6:9 is the only place that tells us: "There is a lad here who has five barley loaves and two small fish." Matt. 14:21 is the only place that tells us: "men, besides women and children."

The emphasis in this lesson is on the lad (boy) who gave what he had to Jesus. Think of the thrill he must have felt to meet Jesus and to see his lunch that he shared used in the miracle of feeding so many people.

Visual Aids: Poster of 5,000 men.

Map: Find land on the other side of the Sea of Galilee from Capernaum.

Worksheet: Stickers -- shared.

Verse: No verse but: He gave his lunch to feed 5,000 men besides women and children.

Special Activities:

Older booklet: The Things I Have Learned-- Fill in today: *want to share what I have with others who need the things that I have.*

Lesson 38

Story: Man born blind -- John 9.

Application: We should not be afraid to stand up for Jesus even when our family, friends, teachers, and even leaders make fun of us.

Study Helps: beggar (9:8)

Defended Jesus who healed him and believed in Jesus--John 9:30-33,38.

Contrast his faith in Jesus

--with his parents who feared the Jews of the synagogue--v. 20-22;

--with the Pharisees unbelief--v. 18,24-29.

Visual Aids: Map of The City of Jerusalem find--Pool of Siloam.

Worksheet: Stickers -- believed in Him; rejoiced; defended; worshiped.

Verse: The man born blind said: "Lord, I believe!" And he worshiped Him. John 9:38

Special Activities:

Older booklet: The Things I Have Learned-- Fill in today: *not to be afraid to stand up for Jesus even when others make fun of me.*

Lesson 39

Story: Syro-Phoenician Greek Woman of Canaan -- Matt. 15:21-28; Mark 7:24-30.

Application: We can pray now and tell God what our greatest need is and He will listen to us.

Study Helps: A Gentile mother who expressed well her belief in His power and her great need for help. God divides the people of the world into two groups--Jews and Gentiles. In other words, anyone who is not a Jew is a Gentile. This woman, being a Greek, was a Gentile.

This story is told by both Matthew and Mark who used different words to tell where she was from. Both accounts tell us that she came to Jesus when He was in "the region of Tyre and Sidon" which was in the ancient country of Phoenicia. Mark tells us that she was "a Greek, a Syro -Phoenician by birth." Matthew calls her "a woman of Canaan...from that region." Canaan (an old name for Palestine, including Phoenicia) is the term used for the Gentile people with a background of the former people from whom the Israelites had taken the land in the time of Joshua. She obviously was acquainted with the fact that Jesus could heal demon-possession. She even knew to call Him "Son of David," which many of the Jews had called Him also in their belief that He was the promised one to sit on the throne of David.

Demon-possession is discussed in these Helps in Lesson 36.

Lord = He who has great power and authority; master; owner.

Visual Aids: Map: Find Syria, Phoenicia, Tyre and Sidon.

Worksheet: Stickers -- worshiped, believed in Him.

Verse: "Have mercy on me, O Lord, Son of David ... Lord, help me!" Matt. 15:22,25

Special Activities:

Lesson 40

Story: Bartimaeus -- Mark 10:46-52.

Application: Even when others try to stop us from following Jesus we must insist on doing it.

Study Helps:

Believed Jesus could heal him and persistently called to him in spite of others trying to deter him. Jesus said: "*Your faith has made you well.*"

Explain: Rabboni -- My master; Teacher.

Visual Aids: Map: Find Jericho.

Worksheet: Stickers -- believed in Him; followed Him.

Younger: *Make the eyes open and close* -- closed eyes are on Extra Things for Worksheets Younger. Cut them out and scotch tape only on the top over the open eyes on the worksheet. With care the eyes can be opened and closed. **Letters needed:** in the name: **e u**.

PART 5 -- LEADERS AND PEOPLE IN AUTHORITY

IMPORTANT NOTE: Read the poster: *I Am Meeting Jesus...aloud* in every lesson to impress on the students' minds that they are deciding how they feel about Jesus as compared to the person or persons they are studying.

There were some rulers of the Jews who believed in Jesus:

Nicodemus and Joseph of Arimathea

but some did not say so because

--afraid of the Jews -- John 19:38;

--afraid of being put out of the synagogue -- John 12:42;

--they loved the praise of men -- John 12:43.

Saul of Tarsus was a Pharisee, son of a Pharisee who persecuted believers but after he met Jesus he became a believer and a preacher -- Acts 23:6; Philippians 3:5.

Later after the church was begun, a great many priests became believers -- Acts 6:7.

Lesson 42

Story: Two Kings Herod

#1- King Herod the Great -- Matt. 2:1-23.

#2- King Herod Antipas -- Luke 3:1,19,20; Matt. 14:1-12; Luke 9:7-9; 23:6-12.

Application: Never do anything to hurt others who might take your special place.

Study Helps: See the chart "*The Herods*" enclosed in this packet.

Not all Herods had title of King. These 2 did.

#1 Matt. 2:1; #2--Matt. 14:9.

#1 Herod at Jesus' birth (called Herod the Great in secular history):

only interested in preserving his power as king to extent of murdering many children in an effort to kill Jesus (Matt. 2).

(Also murdered many of his own family in order to stay in power.)

#2 Herod who killed John and tried Jesus (called Herod Antipas in secular history)

killed John the baptizer -- Matt. 14:1-13.

wanted to kill Jesus -- Luke 13:31.

wanted Jesus to show off with a miracle for him and mocked Him -- Luke 23:8.

Explain: tetrarch -- a ruler, governor of a part of a country under Roman rule.

contempt -- scorn as vile and worthless; dishonor; to look down on with hate.

mock -- to make fun of; laugh at; make sport of; poke fun at.

jealous -- envy.

Visual Aids: Chart: *The Herods* (may be too difficult but good for the teacher's information.)

Maps: On Map *Where...Happened* find #1--Jerusalem, Bethlehem. #2--Jerusalem, region of Galilee; On Map *The City of Jerusalem* find--Herod's palace.

Worksheet: **Stickers for both groups** -- #1--jealous; afraid; rejected Him; tried to kill.

#2--questioned, mocked, rejected Him; wanted to kill.

Verse: #1 King Herod the Great said: *"Go and search carefully for the young Child, and when you have found Him, bring back word to me, that I may come and worship Him also."* Matt. 2:8.

#2 King Herod Antipas: Treated Him with contempt and mocked Him. Luke 23:11.

Special Activities:

Lesson 43

Story: Pilate -- Matt. 27:1,2,11-26; 62-66; Lu. 23:1-7;13-25; John 18;28 to 19:16.

Application: We must put Jesus first regardless of what will happen to us because we do.

Study Helps: Roman governor --Matt. 27:2.

Explain -- Pontius = Pilate's family name.

Questioned Jesus -- Matt. 27:11-14.

Insisted Jesus was innocent of the accusations brought against Him --

John 18:38; 19:4,6; Lu. 23:14, 15,22.

Offered to chastise Him and release Him -- Lu. 23:16,22;

but had Him scourged to try to please the crowd -- Mk. 15:15.

Denied truth he spoke by his actions--Said innocent but condemned to death -- Lu. 23;24.

Washed his hands to try to say he himself was innocent of condemning a just, innocent man to death -- Matt. 27:24.

Made afraid by Jesus -- John 19:8; by wife's dream -- Matt. 27:19 (superstitious?)
 but more afraid of the crowd and condemned for political reasons -- John 19:12-15.
 Set guard at tomb so body could not be stolen -- Matt. 27:62-66
 See the article *Who Crucified Jesus* enclosed with these Helps.

Visual Aids: Poster: *Jesus Died.* Map: *On The City of Jerusalem* find--Judgment Hall.

Worksheet: Stickers -- questioned Him; afraid; rejected Him; killed Him.

Older: To make it easier to find the verses for the exercise "True or False," have the students put a paper marker in Matthew 27 and another in John 18.

Verse: Pilate said: "*I find no fault in Him at all*"... He said to the Jews, "*Behold your King!*" "*I am innocent of the blood of this just Person. You see to it.*" John 18:38; 19:14; Matt. 27:24

NOTE:

There was much interaction between the chief priests, scribes and elders because they made up the ruling council (called Sanhedrin).

Matt. 26:59; Mk. 14:55;15:1; Lu. 22:66; John 11:47.

Sometimes the priests, scribes and elders are called simply "the Jews" -- John 5:16-18; 7:1.

The council (Greek: synedrion; Hebrew: sanhedrin) was made up of 70 members. Most were priests and Sadducean nobles, some Pharisees of which many were scribes, and elders (older men who governed their family or tribal village or area, making all major decisions.) with the High Priest as president. The origin probably goes back to the time of Moses when God commanded that when there was a case "too hard for you to judge... matters of controversy within your gates... you shall come to the priests, the Levites, and to the judge there in those days, and inquire of them; they shall pronounce upon you the sentence of judgment." (Deut. 17:8-11;21:5)

The Pharisees were closely allied with the scribes, as Matt. 23 indicates, and are never joined in a Bible event with only the elders. The chief priests (Sadducees) however were often joined with the elders of the people in their activities.

The chief priests, rulers, scribes, elders, Pharisees, Sadducees, and High Priests were involved separately and together in desire and efforts to get rid of Jesus.-- Matt. 26:3,4; Lu. 22:2; Lu. 23:13-18.

See the article: *Who Crucified Jesus?*

Why the leaders of the Jews wanted to kill Jesus:

They were angry because they claimed that Jesus broke the Sabbath -- Lu. 6:7,11; 13:14.

They hated Jesus because He testified:

that their works were evil -- John 7:7; 15:18;

about their sin -- John 15:22;

that they did not keep Jesus' word -- John 15:20;

that they did not know God who sent Jesus -- John 15:21;

that they hated both the Father and the Son -- John 15:24.

that they were wicked -- Matt. 21:41, 45-46;

that "My word has no place in you." -- John 8:37

Admitted Jesus did miracles -- John 11:47.

But they feared "Everyone will believe in Him and the Romans will come and take away our place and our nation" -- John 11:48.

Sought how they might kill Jesus but were afraid of the people who believed in Him --
 Lu. 22:2; John 11:48,53;
 For envy delivered up Jesus to be killed -- Matt. 27:18.

Lesson 44

Story: Pharisees -- Lu. 6:6-11; 13:10-17; Matthew 23:1-33; John 11:43-53. These should be the main story material but also include some of the material found in Study Helps.

Application: We cannot change what God says to what we think is right because then we are not obeying God's commands.

Study Helps:

"Pharisee" means "separated one." The Pharisees were one of the groups of religious leaders of the Jews. They believed in strictly keeping the Law of Moses but made the traditions of men, which were ideas of what the laws meant, just as important to them as God's Law.

They wore special clothes so everyone would know who they were -- Matt. 23:5:

made the tassels on their garments long;

made their phylacteries broad (to be seen of men). Phylacteries were small leather cases containing Scriptures from the O.T.--Ex. 13:6-10,12,14,16; Deut. 6:4-9; 11:18-21. Long strips of leather were attached to the cases so they could be tied to the forehead and forearms. The Jews took these Scriptures literally instead of what God meant. He wanted their obedience from the heart, to use their "hands" to do what He said, and their minds ("between your eyes") to think about what He had done for them. Their religion was external and not of the heart but self-righteous and hypocritical.

They thought they were the only ones who understood God and His word.

Highly respected teachers of the Law by the people.

Jesus called them a generation of vipers, hypocrites, fools, and blind guides:

for being evil speaking --Matt. 12:34; 23:33.

for their self-righteousness -- Matt. 5:20.

for making gold on the temple more important than God's temple -- Matt. 23:16-22.

for their pride against others --Matt. 9:11,12.

for their lack of mercy on the Sabbath -- Matt. 12:2-7.

for their love of money -- Lu. 16:11-14.

The Pharisees accused Jesus of blasphemy -- Lu. 5:21:

of being in league with the devil -- Matt. 9:34; John 7:20.

of breaking the Law -- Lu. 6:1-2.

Used the Sabbath day to test and accuse Jesus:

Matt. 12:1-8 (plucked grain);

Lu. 6:6-11 (healed withered hand);

Lu. 14:1-5 (healed man with dropsy);

John 5:1-18 (healed cripple by pool);

John 9:16 (healed man born blind).

Admitted Jesus had done many signs --John 11:47 but refused to believe for fear of loss of power and authority over the people -- John 11:48.

Questioned Jesus to test or trick Him to be able to accuse Him:

about taxes -- Matt. 22:15;

asked for a sign even though they had seen some of His miracles -- Mk. 8:11;

about divorce -- Matt. 19:3;

concerning adultery -- John 8:3-6;

about many things -- Lu. 11:53,54.

Derided (mocked) Him for His teaching -- Lu. 16:14.
 Misused Scripture against Jesus -- John 7:27,52 (Isa. 9:1-2); Matt. 4:14-17.
 Called Jesus a sinner -- John 9:24.
 Chose "Moses" over Jesus -- John 9:28,29.
 Claimed to honor God but rejected His Son -- John 5:23.
 Did not believe in Jesus -- John 5:38; or God's word -- 8:37,45.
 Put anyone who believed in Jesus out of the synagogue -- John 9:22;
 Tried to stone Jesus -- John 8:58-59 "I AM"; John 10:30-33 "I and My Father are One";
 John 5:18 -- because He made Himself equal to God.
 Persecuted Jesus and sought to kill Him -- John 5:16,18.
 Plotted to destroy Jesus and put Him to death --
 Mk. 3:1-6 because Jesus healed on the Sabbath;
 Lu. 19:47 together with chief priest, scribes, elders, leaders of the people
 because Jesus drove them out of the temple for selling there;
 John 11:47-48 because "everyone will believe in Him, and the Romans will come
 and take away both our place and nation."
 John 12:17-19 because "Look, the world has gone after Him!" (jealousy-envy);
 Mk. 14:1 by a sly way (trickery);
 Mk. 14:55-57 by using false testimony at Jesus' trial.
 Other Scriptures involving the Pharisees: Matt. 5:20; 22:34-46; 27:62-66 (Matt. 16:1-12
 with Sadducees) Mk. 2:16-28; 7:1-13; Lu. 5:17-26; 15:1-32.

Lesson 45

Story: Scribes -- Mark 2:1-12; 3:22-30.

Application: We have to be careful not to let anything become more important than Jesus. We
 must be willing to give up everything in order to obey Jesus.

Study Helps: A scribe is a person who writes or copies by hand.

Scripture means writings. Script means handwriting.

The scribes held positions as experts in the law of Moses and taught the law (Lu. 5:17,21). They were sometimes called lawyers (Lu. 14:3). Very influential with the people.

The scribes held public offices as the official public writers and copies of the Law even in Old Testament times (ex. 2 Sam. 8:17). Bible times were before the printing press was invented.

They were frequently associated with the Pharisees, the religious party to which most belonged (Matt. 23). Some scribes belonged to another religious party called the Sadducees.

With the Pharisees they loved being called "Rabbi" (honorable teacher) (Matt. 23:1,6).

They wore distinctive long robes, loved greetings in the market place, the best seats in the synagogue, the best places at the feasts; for a pretense (to show off) made long prayers (Matt. 23:5,6; Lu. 20:46,47).

They were teachers and experts in the Law to which they added as requirements their interpretations (traditions of the elders) -- Matt. 7:29; 23:4; Lu. 11:46.

Called "hypocrites" by Jesus many times -- Matt. 23:13,14,15,23,25,27,28,29.

Greedy ("extortion and self-indulgence")-- Matt. 23:25; Lu. 20:46,47.

Members of the Jewish ruling council (Sanhedrin) -- Mark 15:1.

Involved in condemning Jesus to death -- Mark 14:1, 43-45, 53-65; as Jesus had predicted--Matt. 16:21. See article *Who Crucified Jesus* enclosed in these Helps.

Accused Jesus with rest of the council before Pilate of anything to condemn Him to death: --an evildoer -- John 18:30;

--that He claimed to be Christ a King -- Lu. 23:2;

--He stirs up the people, teaching in all Judea, from Galilee to this place."-- Lu. 23:5;

--of perverting the nation -- Lu. 23:2;

--of forbidding to pay taxes to Caesar -- Lu. 23:2;

--that He made Himself Son of God -- John 19:7.

Mocked Jesus on the cross -- Mk. 15:31; Matt. 27:41.

Incidents in which they are named alone :

Healing paralytic lowered through the roof -- Mk. 2:6;

Accused Jesus of casting out demons by Beelzebub -- Mark 3:22;

Disputed with the disciples -- Mk. 9:14;

They said one time: "Teacher you answered well." -- Lu. 20:39;

Jesus said to beware of the scribes -- Lu. 20:46-47.

The materials that the scribes used:

The "paper" of that time was made of papyrus, a reed that grew by rivers, especially the Nile in Egypt. The stalks were sliced thinly lengthwise and pieces laid side by side horizontally to form a page. Others were laid vertically on top. They were then mashed together and laid in the sun to dry. After scraping and rubbing the piece they had a piece of paper like our heavy wrapping paper only thicker.

For important documents, animal skins, scraped and cleaned, then sewed together to make the length needed were used. Parchment was also made of animal skins which had been whitened and treated to make a finer material.

All 3 of these were made into scrolls so they could be rolled up on a stick at each end for easier handling and storage. Scrolls of the Law of Moses are still used in Jewish synagogues.

The instruments used to write with were maybe a stylus or a quill.

The ink of the Jews was probably a lamp-black and gum. The New Testament books were written on papyrus with a vegetable soot mixed with gum (or another combination) and moistened as needed.

Hebrew scrolls were written in columns from right to left (the opposite way we write and read in English).

Lesson 46

Story: chief priests (Sadducees) & elders--Matt. 21:23-27; Matt. 26:14,15 with 27:3; Lu. 22:47-54; Matt. 26:59-68; Mark. 15:1; Matt. 27:12,20-22; 27:41-43; Matt. 28:11-15; Acts 23:8.

Application: We must be careful not to listen to false religious teachers.

Study Helps:

"Chief priests" were about the same as Sadducees. Very unpopular with the people.

Sadducees were priests, a sect of the Jews, politicians who favored cooperating with the Romans. They were well-to-do people with no common people in their group.

Sadducees said that there is no resurrection nor angel nor spirit. Acts 23:8

"Elders" were older men who acted as local judges and rulers of each city. Some of these were in the ruling Council in Jerusalem which condemned Jesus to die. They are frequently together with the chief priests against Jesus.

Matt. 21:23-27 -- the chief priests and the elders of the people questioned His authority.

Matt. 26:14,15 -- Judas was paid 30 pieces of silver to betray Jesus by the chief priests.

Lu. 22:49-54 -- chief priests, captains of the temple, the elders, and Judas arrested Jesus.

Matt. 26:59 -- "The chief priests, the elders, and all the council sought false testimony against Jesus to put Him to death."

Mark. 15:1 -- "The chief priests with the elders and scribes and the whole council; bound Jesus and delivered Him to Pilate."

Matt. 27:3 -- Judas brought back the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and elders.

Matt. 27:12,20-21 -- chief priests and elders accused Jesus before Pilate (of many things -- Mk. 15:3). The chief priests and elders persuaded the multitudes to ask for Barabbas and destroy Jesus. They all said to him, "Let Him be crucified!"

John 19:6,15 -- When the chief priests and officers saw Him, they cried out, "Crucify Him, crucify Him!" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but Caesar!"

Matt. 27:41-43 -- the chief priests mocked Jesus on the cross with the scribes and elders.

Matt. 28:11-15 -- the chief priests with the elders gave a large sum of money to the soldiers to lie about the empty tomb.

Unbelievers who tried to trip Jesus up with questions -- Matt. 22:23-34.

Sometimes worked with the Pharisees against Jesus -- Matt. 16:1-4.

Were envious of Jesus -- Matt. 27:12,18.

Plotted to put Lazarus to death also -- John 12:10.

See the article *Who Crucified Jesus* enclosed with these Helps.

Visual Aids: Picture--Council of the Jews.

Map of *The City of Jerusalem* find--Hall of the Council.

Poster: *Jesus Died*.

Lesson 47

Story: High priests, Annas and Caiaphas -- John 11:47-53; Matt. 26:3-5; John 18:12-14,19-24; Matt. 26:57-68; Mk. 14:53-65.

Application: Religious leaders are not always right. Check what they say by what the Bible says.

Study Helps:

The High Priest was a **position** of high standing over the people of Israel. The first high priest, Aaron, was appointed by God to minister to Him as priest (Ex. 28:1). The term "high priest" is not used in the Old Testament but such terms as "Aaron the priest" (Num. 3:6; 4:33; Lev. 1:7).

At the beginning and for some time, the **successor** to the high priesthood was from father to son (Ex. 29:29,30; Num. 20:25-29). Later in history, the high priest was appointed or chosen by the council which was called the Sanhedrin. Many times there was the high priest and a second high priest who was like a substitute. In the time when Jesus was on earth the appointment had become involved in politics. It seems **Annas** was the high priest and **Caiaphas** was the second high priest. Herod the Great (Herod at the time of Jesus' birth) murdered the high priest and made unqualified men high priest according to his will. At one time a man named Ananus and his 5 sons took turns being high priest. The last high priest before the destruction of Jerusalem in 70 AD was chosen by the zealots by lot.

His garments (Ex. 28:4) were made according to God's instructions and were for glory and beauty (Ex. 28:2). They were holy to be worn to minister to God (Ex. 28:3). The high priest, his sons, and their garments were concentrated to do their holy work by being anointed with oil (Ex. 29:21; Lev. 8:12).

breastplate--a gold plate with 12 precious gems on which were written the names of the sons of Israel for judgment (Ex. 28:21,30).

ephod--in two pieces fastened at the shoulders with 2 large onyx stones on which was written the sons of Israel as a memorial (Ex. 28:12).

robe of the ephod--under the ephod, the hem trimmed with pomegranates and gold bells Ex. 39:22-26).

tunic--a brodered coat undergarment (Ex. 28:4).

trousers--undergarment (Ex. 28:42).

sash--long belt-like piece wound around the waist several times (Lev. 8:7).

turban--on the head (Lev. 8:9).

mitre--fastened on the turban, a plate of pure gold that had engraved on it:

HOLINESS TO THE LORD because the high priest bore the sin of the holy things offered so that they would be accepted before the Lord (Ex. 28:36-38).

The **duties** of the high priest were to offer sacrifices for the people with the help of the

priests who were descendants of Aaron of the tribe of Levi. He was the only one that entered the part of the temple called the Holy of Holies where the ark of God was and only once a year on the day of Atonement to sprinkle blood of the special sacrifice he made for the people (Lev. 16).

The high priest was the president of the council. The council (Matt. 26:59; John 11:47) was called the Sanhedrin (Gr. sunedrion means council). This Great Council of Jews which met in Jerusalem had 71 members who were important members of the high priest's, elders' and scribes' families. The council was like a supreme court which tried important cases.

The council held an unfair trial for Jesus by calling false witnesses (Matt. 26:59-61) in order to carry out their plot to kill Jesus. But the witnesses did not agree (Mk. 14:55-59). In spite of this the council condemned Jesus to death. They had prejudged Jesus as guilty before the trial. Many have said it was an illegal trial but the Bible does not use the term *illegal*. It was illegal in the sense that it broke rules that the council had made for itself to follow in all cases they judged. Several of those were:

- No session of the council could be held at night;
- Witnesses favoring the accused were to be heard;
- There was to be a period of 24 hours delay between sentence and the execution.

The Jews who were accusing Jesus of breaking the Law of God were not even obeying the Law themselves having 2 High Priests at the same time. Even though they admitted that Jesus did powerful miracles (John 11:47) the council, including the high priest, plotted to take Jesus by trickery and kill Him (Matt. 26:3,4).

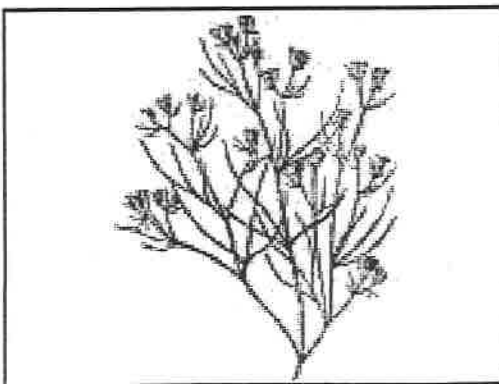
Mint

The Meaning of Names

Christ is the name in English.

Χριστος (pronounced *Christos*) is Christ in Greek.
משיח (mashiach) Messiah is Christ in Hebrew, the language of the Old Testament.
They all mean "anointed One."

In the garden where Jesus was praying the chief priests, captains of the temple, and the elders came with Judas to arrest Jesus. When they brought Jesus to the chief priests, the elders, and all the council, they sought false testimony against Jesus to put Him to death. Then they bound Jesus, led Him away, and delivered Him to Pilate where they accused Jesus falsely. Judas brought back the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and elders. The chief priests and elders persuaded the multitudes that they should ask for Barabbas and destroy Jesus. Pilate asked: "What then shall I do with Jesus who is called Christ?" They all said to him, "Crucify Him, crucify Him!" Pilate said to them, "Shall I crucify your King?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but Caesar! The chief priests mocked Jesus on the cross with the scribes and elders.
