

The Little Horn of Rome

Daniel chapter 7, especially verses 8, 20-21, 24-26
Directly related: Revelation chapters 13, 16, 17, 18
Indirectly related: 2 Thessalonians 2:1-12

Noteworthy characteristics of the Little Horn of Rome:

- 1) Comes to power after ten horns come to power
(note Rev. 17:12)
- 2) Different from the ten horns
- 3) Persecutes and makes war against the saints
- 4) Speaks blasphemies against God
- 5) Changes times and law



Length of time the Little Horn of Rome exercised maximum power:

Considering seven texts that mention the same period of time:

time (1), times (2) and half ($\frac{1}{2}$) a time = 3½ times 1260 days / 30 days per month = 42 months / 12 months per year = 3½ years The three terms are the equivalent length of time.		
Dan. 7:25	3 ½ TIMES	little horn has power over the saints
12:7	3 ½ TIMES	power of the holy people shattered
Rev. 11:2	42 MONTHS	nations trample holy city
11:3	1260 DAYS	God's two witnesses prophesy in sackcloth
12:6	1260 DAYS	God nourishes woman in wilderness
12:14	3 ½ TIMES	women nourished and protected in wilderness
13:5	42 MONTHS	beast has authority to act
A literal 3½ years is far too brief for fulfillment of these events. A prophetic time key - Ezekiel 4:4-6 - "I have appointed to you each day for a year." 1260 days = 1260 years		

Suggested dates of fulfillment - A.D. 533 - A.D. 1793

From: Emperor Justinian's decree that the Pope is the Head of all the churches

To: The French Revolution's overthrow of the Pope's political power

Note: This is not the total time of the existence of the Little Horn,
but rather the period of time that the Little Horn exercised maximum power

Dire warning in Revelation 18:1-4 for those who fellowship with Rome:

"Come out of her, my people, that you have no participation in her sins, and that you don't receive of her plagues." (compare 2 Corinthians 6:14-18)
